Screening for K-2 and Dyslexia

6-12 Literacy

Literacy specialists Judy Fields and Angie Greiner initiated the transition of Critical Reading into an online asynchronous course in the Canvas Learning Management system. Critical Reading was also offered face-to-face in late June as COVID-19 social distancing guidelines allowed. For Fall 2020 and Spring 2021, Critical Reading training will be offered online through NWAESC. Face-to-face Critical Reading training will be scheduled for Summer 2021. Collectively, Angie and Judy trained approximately 318 educators in 3-6 R.I.S.E. Academy Days 1-6, stand-alone Science of Reading Encoding, Vocabulary, and Content Area Reading Strategies, and Critical Reading Days 1-4.

Critical Reading

The Co-op is offering Critical Reading as an <u>online option</u> this semester. Each day is available in Canvas LMS as Self-Paced Learning Modules. Participants have 30 days to complete each day of Critical Reading online. It is designed to give teachers flexibility and complete all 4 days by December 31st. Participants must register in ESC Works by the dates posted for each day. Participants will then be enrolled into Canvas LMS to complete each session.

ELPA21 (English Language Proficiency Assessment)

The state testing window for English Learners is January 25 - March 5 (window extended 2 weeks). Information about the summative assessment is in the <u>ELPA21 Livebinder</u>.

Technical Support

The DESE ESOL Specialist Team has determined districts in the greatest need for technical assistance using a risk assessment. This data will inform our targeted work with districts in our cooperative areas.

State Initiatives

- Systematic English Language Development (SysELD): we are wrapping up our third year of partnering with DESE and EL Achieve (http://www.elachieve.org/) to provide quality dedicated English instruction to language learners statewide. At this point, there are 27 districts being impacted by this partnership in the following co-op areas:
 - Crowley's Ridge 2
 - O Dawson 4
 - o Guy Fenter 1
 - o Northeast 1
 - Northwest 9
 - o Pulaski County 1
 - Wilbur D. Mills 9

Members of the ESOL Team have successfully completed an apprenticeship with the company and are now certified presenters for the state. We have worked closely with EL Achieve in developing professional development virtually for this school year for both ELD teachers and district/building administrators; we started our latest cohort in early September 2020 and finished the 5-day teacher institute in December 2020. Administrator training will be completed in February 2021 with coaching/mentoring sessions scheduled as needed.

The EL Unit has met with several other district coordinators in recent months to provide more information about joining our partnership. *If your district is interested in learning more about this initiative, please contact Lisa Coats.*

• Intention Planning Practice (IPP): we are completing our 3rd year in partnering with DESE and Education Northwest (https://educationnorthwest.org/) to provide area districts in this program to insure that English Learners are being supported in the content areas. This model includes professional development for teachers/instructional leaders as well as on-site coaching visits with follow-up and planning. All ESOL Specialists are collaborating to provide professional development to educators from the Northeast and Dawson cooperatives. The team will be sharing information at district coordinator meetings to plan for the 2021-2022 school year.

- The Arkansas MEP director stated, "Provision of services (across the state) improved thanks to your and your staff's hard work and dedication." This means that the MEP program provided more services (tutoring, health, and other allowable services) over the past year than in previous years. This increase took place during a pandemic.
