Summary: 2024-2025 Consolidated District Plan for Federal Title Funding

- **Utilization:** Funds are allocated for the salaries of Reading Specialists and essential materials for Title I students in DuJardin and Westfield schools.

Title II: Preparing, Training, and Recruiting High-Quality Teachers, Principals, or Other School Leaders

- **Purpose:** To improve the quality and effectiveness of teachers, principals, and other school leaders.
- **Utilization:** Funds are designated for professional development opportunities, focusing on the analysis and application of MAP (Measures of Academic Progress) data, as well as enhancing math and science instruction.

Title III: Language Instruction for English Learners and Immigrant Students

- **Purpose:** To ensure that English Learners (EL) attain English proficiency and develop high levels of academic achievement in English.
- **Utilization:** Funds are used for phonics resources and translation devices, along with ongoing professional development for EL staff, ensuring that EL students receive appropriate support and instruction.

Title IV: Student Support and Academic Enrichment

- **Purpose:** To improve students' academic achievement by increasing the capacity of states, local educational agencies, schools, and local communities to provide all students with access to a well-rounded education.
- **Utilization:** Funds are allocated for Social Studies resources and the college and career readiness program at Westfield, enhancing the comprehensive educational experience for students.

IDEA (Individuals with Disabilities Education Act): Special Education Funding

- **Purpose:** To support the provision of early intervention services, special education, and related services to children with disabilities.
- **Utilization:** IDEA funds are directed towards support for homeless and neglected students and the preschool program, ensuring that all students with disabilities receive the services they need to succeed.
