1. Opening Ceremonies

a. Student Arrival Time - 8:30am

- b. Parade of Flags
 - i. Students will line up OUTSIDE the school along the sidewalk
 - ii. Find the name of your affiliation (state or country) on the wall
 - iii. Line up under your affiliation sign
 - iv. Flags will be handed out to the designated flag bearers
 - v. Students will parade into the opening ceremonies with their flag
 - vi. Students will sit in the designated students' seats at the front of the Opening Ceremonies
 - vii. Students should wear your International History Olympiad t-shirt

c. Spectator Procedures

- i. Friends and Family will enter the school and take a seat in the courtyard while the students are preparing for the Parade.
- ii. Please do NOT leave empty seats so that there is room for every one!
- iii. Please remember that you must have a badge (and therefore be part of the Friends and Family program) to attend the Opening Ceremonies or any other event at the school.

d. PLEASE NOTE: prepare for it to rain! Having a rain jacket/poncho and an umbrella is highly recommended.

i. If you do not bring a rain jacket, then you consider bringing a change of clothes!

2. Check In

- a. You do NOT have to check in each day you check in once and get your badge. Your badge must be worn EVERY day as that is how security knows to let you into the school (this true for both competing students and family members)
- b. If you have not checked in yet, Check In opens at 7:30am and closes at
 8:30am. Please come check in early enough so that you can get lined up for the parade in time. Check in is in the Cafeteria right off the courtyard of the school

3. Metro Tickets

- a. If you are scheduled for an offsite field trip for this week, you can pick up your metro pass in the Cafeteria. Please see the desk on the right side (opposite of the Help Desk) to pick up your Metro pass.

Dear Olympians, Family Members, and Friends!

Bienvenue! Welcome to Paris to all of those that have arrived and safe travels to those who are still on their way! This is the first of the nightly emails that will typically go out late each evening. They will have all the information you need for the following day. We have some important information for your arrival and for Arrival Day / "Day 0." Please remember that all General Emails <u>are accessible here</u> through <u>this link</u> on the Olympiad website.

1. Check In

- a. Time Check In starts at Noon tomorrow (Saturday, July 19th) and goes until
 9pm (one hour later than originally posted see the schedule). Late check is from 7:30-8:30am on Sunday, July 20th.
- b. *Location* Ecole Jeannine Manuel School in the Cantina (on the inner courtyard you can't miss it)
- c. *Directions* Make sure to use the entrance of the school that is located on Avenue Emile Zola. The doors on Rue de Theatre will NOT be open.
 - i. Address to use for google maps / taxis / Uber: 115 Avenue Émile Zola
 - ii. If the door is not open when you arrive (after noon!), there is a button on the wall to your left. Press it for security to buzz you into the school
 - iii. Once you enter the school, walk forward into the courtyard, the cantina will be to your left
- d. Badges you will receive your International History Olympiad badge at check in. You will need to wear it at ALL times when you are on campus, or on a field trip. 4. Practice

- a. Buzzer When you check in, we will have a number of practice rooms ongoing throughout the day from noon-8pm for standard buzzer practice. To the extent possible, we will try and group these by general age range. We will play questions using standard Olympiad rules for the History Bee and the History Bowl. Further information on which rooms will have buzzer practice ongoing will be provided at check-in.
- b. Knockout Knockout is an event unique to IAC World Championship level events. We'll be playing the 2023 Knockout set for practice (this set isn't otherwise online) every hour on the hour from 1pm-7pm. A sign up sheet will be provided at check-in. Knockout takes place on Sunday, so this will be a good time to test it out!

5. Help Desk

a. Location - the Cantina (same place as check in). Please continue to email olympiad@iacompetitions.com as well for questions (please do not respond to this email with any Olympiad questions unless I specifically ask something of you).

6. Press Corps

a. Please see Kiersten Brown at the Help Desk for your assignments once you have checked in. We'll have lots for you to do throughout the week!

7. Music Program

Dear Historians, Families, Friends, and Staff of the 2025 International History Olympiad!

We're less than two weeks away from the start of all the fun in Paris! You can expect more frequent (and shorter) update emails between now and then, so that we can keep you posted on everything you need to know.

Here then is your Olympiad news for July 10:

1. Health Form - REQUIRED

Please find the 2025 Olympiad Health and Medical Form linked here. Many of you have already filled this out, but if not, please do so as soon as possible. Filling this out is a requirement for Competing Students at the Olympiad, regardless of whether you are coming with your parents or not (as there will be cases when your parents are not in the room, for instance, during exams). It will help us tremendously if you can fill this out as soon as possible, but please note that you will not be able to complete check in and be able to compete in any Olympiad event until we have received this form.

2. Discounted Hotel Rooms Available

We have a few extra rooms (1 single room, 8 twin rooms - i.e. with 2 single beds) at **Hotel Massena** in an extra block of rooms we had booked in case we needed it. These are available from the 18th or 19th through the morning of the 27th for 100 euros per night for the single room or 140 euros for the twin room, plus the 5.53 euro per person per night city tax (but other taxes and breakfast included). This hotel is in a very nice central part of the city and is accessible **by a single metro line to the school** within 25 minutes.

3. Pre-Olympiad Survey

If you are a Competing Student (i.e. not students enrolled in the Family and Friends Program), please fill out the <u>Pre-Olympiad Survey Here!</u> This has the Scramble sign-up (see below), and a number of other questions that we would like to hear from you about. The survey only takes 3-5 minutes to complete, but it will greatly help us to ensure a successful Olympiad.

4. Scramble Topic!

In keeping with Paris's reputation for being the world capital of looking chic, we're excited to announce that **the Scramble topic for the 2025 International History Olympiad will be the <u>History of Fashion!</u> This includes clothing, garments, and fashion accessories of all sorts (including footwear, outerwear, uniforms, hats, jewelry, etc.) throughout history up to the present day. A general distribution of questions for this will be posted to the <u>bottom portion of the Syllabus shortly</u>. Please <u>read here</u> for more information about the Scramble on its event description.**

Please sign up for the Scramble through the Survey! We know that there was a Scramble sign up link on the original Event Selection Form, but we need you to reconfirm your interest in competing in the Scramble, now that the topic has been announced. And if you did not originally sign up, you are welcome to do so. **The**

Scramble sign up runs through July 15 at 11:59pm PDT (Los Angeles time). We will send at least one reminder email between now and then.

5. Adding Events

If you wish to continue to add multiple choice exams, that's fine, but for a few more days only. Field trips are solely on a case by case basis depending on availability. For other competitions, in most cases, we can still add you, though we cannot make guarantees at this point. If you wish to add events, please continue to use the **Schedule Change Form**.

Note that it will get increasingly difficult to add events, so if you wish to do so, please do this as soon as possible. And please note that with few exceptions, adding events at the Olympiad itself will not be possible!

And for those few of you who haven't filled in your <u>Event Selection Forms</u> at all, this is yet another reminder to do that as soon as possible!

6. Connecting with your Affiliation Teammates

If you'd like to be connected with your teammates from your affiliation prior to the Olympiad to strategize, find others to plan excursions with, or for any other valid reason, please indicate that on the Survey. Note that by definition, this means that we'll be sharing your email address with everyone else who opts in for this from your affiliation, so please only select this option on the Survey if you are comfortable with that.

7. Payments / Visas

As a reminder, no students (with the exception of students from EJM who are also staffing) will be able to take part in the Olympiad until and unless payment has been received in full. In an extreme case, we can accept cash (in US dollars or euros) in Paris, but we recommend paying by the usual check or wire transfer methods. For students waiting on visa decisions, please hold off on submitting payments until you have received your visa or not.

8. Things to Bring

This advice was too long to post here, but <u>please do read this</u>, particularly about the need for laptops for the computer game / Historical Debating competitions, and the advice on having a handheld fan.

9. Two Updates on Gameplay

A. Please note that a full Official Rules file for the International History Bowl World Championships has been updated and uploaded here. This contains information on three-way play which will be used in the preliminary rounds and potentially

- some playoff rounds. The exact structure of the History Bowl will be determined only in the final few days before the Olympiad to account for changes in the number of Competing Students (e.g. students still waiting on visa applications) as much as possible. We will post this when available, along with the rosters for mixed affiliation teams, but those are not available yet.
- B. In Bee competitions (including the Bees in languages other than English, as well as the Scramble and the Blitz), we are instituting a rule that in the finals (though not the preliminary rounds), as many students as possible can attempt to answer a question. Three incorrect answers will thus NOT kill the question, but the question will go dead once three seconds have elapsed after the reader finishes reading, or the last buzz occurred. We will solicit player feedback on this change to see if it will become standard practice at IAC championship level tournaments in the future.

10. Other Various Updates

- B. If you are competing in Table Combined, yes, you may bring and use your own table tennis / ping pong paddle. Otherwise, we will have these available for use you do not need to bring your own.
- C. Don't forget to follow us on Social Media! Frequent Olympiad updates and posts are made to the International Academic Competitions <u>Facebook Page</u> and <u>Instagram account</u>.
- D. For students in the Historical Simulations, please note that while there will be no formal private directives for each delegate, as delegates will be encouraged to work with each other to come to solutions, there will be opportunities for delegates to exercise individual powers should situations call for them. The Simulation Staff will inform delegates of these opportunities when applicable. (Note: if this doesn't make sense to you, don't worry this is meant for students experienced with Model UN and Historical Simulation crisis committees who have asked about this).

11. Next Emails

The next General Email will come on July 13 (if you are in the Americas or Europe) or July 14 (if you are in Asia or New Zealand). For students in the Music Program and participants on the Pre-Tour to Normandy and Brittany, additional emails with further details will be sent out tomorrow. Unaccompanied Students will receive an update email on the 12th / 13th depending on your part of the world. With the exception of
