## ACTIVITIES THAT STIMULATE THE EARLY DEVELOPMENT OF CHILDREN

## Auditory discrimination







- Imagine that our box is a car, when driving it, imitate the sound "vroom, vroom"
- Imitate sounds of different types of transportátion, imagine that the box is one of them.

#### **Imagination**







- Imagine that the box is a boat, a car or a train.
- Pretend that you are going on a trip, what type of transportation do you need if you go to school?

#### Visual Discrimination





- Compare the shapes and size of the box with a smaller or larger box.
- Look for objects of the same color as your box.

### Cause effect **Key Question:** What if?

## Self-concept





- Recognize that he has two hands and the box has two handles.
- Recognize his name written on the box.

## Development of Fine/ Gross Motor Skills



- Tell the child to pull and push the box with some toys inside.
- Put different sizes of toys and let the child take them out one by one.

- Count the toys while putting them in or taking them out

#### Executive function





- Call the child by name -identity who I am, showing the name on the box.
- Praise the child the times he picks up her toys - develops a sense of pride.

- Name and trace the first letter of the name with your fingers.
- Search at home or in a book for words or objects that begin with the first letter of their name.
