Additional equipment

Focus on takeoffs/landings for the first little while

Ideally, we want to see you get to 25 flights as quickly as possible to help you to feel more confident with your takeoffs and landings. I encourage you to focus on doing pattern work and dialing in your ability to land right where you meant to. Once your spot landings and general takeoff/landing technique is dialed in, you will feel more confident to go out and explore more and have fun flying. Remember...you are always welcome at any of our courses!!

Keep Learning

You have the Powered Paragliding Bible. Please read through the whole thing! Now that you've completed the basic training course and have a few flights under your belt, you will understand and appreciate the info in that book a lot more than you would have before training. Read it all, and then reread it all down the road. You'll be surprised how much more some of those concepts and ideas will click once you've been flying for a while. Spark Plug

Spark Gap should 0.9 mm

Belt

How tight should the belt be? You can use a tuning app on your phone to measure the frequency when you strum the belt. The Moster 185 Plus (clutched) uses a belt with **13** grooves. If you have a different motor with a belt with 15 grooves, the frequencies are different. See the info below:

Monster 185 Plus (clutched) - Belt model: Optibelt **13** GOLE PJ483 When the belt is new, it should measure: 500-520Hz (only new) When re-tensioning, you should measure: **430-450Hz**

Pitch (Tuning app to check belt tension) iOS - Pitch - Chromatic Tuner App by Frozen Ape

Compression port can be cleaned carefully with a 2.5mm drill bit inside the cylinder head. The symptom for a blocked compression port is that the pull cord is really hard to pull.
