

## Swygert - Substitute Teacher Activity Grid

To give you some freedom and choice in your activities during days I am absent, I have created a substitute teacher activity grid! You should choose one of the assignments below to complete during class whenever I am absent. The next time I am absent, you may choose another, BUT it must be in the same column, row, or diagonal (think BINGO). If I am absent more than four days, your next assignments should begin in another row. When you complete your assignment, include the number of the assignment you chose. This page should be passed out and taken up by the sub. When an assignment is completed, circle it on your grid. Make sure you turn in your finished work with the sub if it is physically done and on Canvas if electronic.

All writing assignments should be done in 12 pt Times New Roman font and should be doubled spaced.

<p>1. Create a poster titled "Top Ten Reasons To Join FFA!" Second, create a brochure encouraging freshmen to join the FFA. Include the mission of the FFA, a description of the organization, benefits, activities, and any other information you think would be helpful in recruitment.</p>	<p>2. Choose an agriculture-related magazine article that interests you. Create an advertisement for this article (think billboard) and write a one-page summary (250 words) of the article and why you chose it. Be sure to staple your article to your work.</p>	<p>3. Create a poster in support of Ag Literacy. Write one page (250 words) describing your poster and how knowledge of agriculture is important for EVERYONE.</p>	<p>4. Find an article that discusses either a new technology/advancement in agriculture or a misconception in agriculture. Write a two-page (500 words) letter to the general public explaining why it is important for everyone to know about the subject. Be sure to include the article URL you chose.</p>
<p>5. Identify three skills or habits that you feel are the most important for high school students to learn to be successful in their future. Write two pages (500 words) explaining how these will make them successful.</p>	<p>6. Create an adventure storybook for an elementary schooler that is related to agriculture. Your book must be a minimum of ten pages and be fully colored (not electronically- physical book only).</p>	<p>7. Create a poster informing students about the types and importance of SAEs. Include your SAE as an example with a description. Write one page (250 words) explaining your poster and the importance of SAEs.</p>	<p>8. Choose an agriculture-related legislative bill that has recently been passed or is on the floor to be voted on in SC or the US. Write a 2-page (500 words) letter to our local legislators discussing the law's impact on agriculturalists and why they should or should not support the bill/law.</p>
<p>9. Design a t-shirt for next year's FFA Chapter. The t-shirt should include and depict the theme of your choice. Write one page (250 words) describing why you chose this theme.</p>	<p>10. Create a poster promoting Career and Technical Education. Write a one-page (250 words) explanation of your poster.</p>	<p>11. Create a poster introducing an important person in agriculture (past or present). Write at least one page (250 words) highlighting the individual's life history and impact to the agriculture industry we know today.</p>	<p>12. Create a brochure for the SHS Agriculture Department. Items that could be included: classes offered, class descriptions, benefits/advantages, and the importance of agriculture (Electronic or physical. Needs to have 6 sections like a front and back brochure)</p>
<p>13. Many important events have happened throughout our history that has significantly impacted agriculture. Write two pages (500 words) discussing the important events of agriculture history and why it is important for Americans to understand it.</p>	<p>14. Create a song or poem. The theme of your song/poem may be the FFA, ag literacy, or the latest unit you are studying. Your song/poem must be at least one page (250 words).</p>	<p>15. Write a 2-page (500 words) news article for the Seneca Journal. Choose from the following topics: college and career readiness, ag literacy, being a positive influence, and 21st-century skills.</p>	<p>16. Write a two-page (500 words) letter thanking someone who has positively influenced your life.</p>
