

MONET IN A BOX: DISCOVER IMPRESSIONISM

Note: we recommend teaching our Monet Box in this order: <u>Discover</u>

<u>Impressionism + Sky Swatch Watercolor Practice</u>, <u>Meet Madame Monet</u>. <u>Water</u>

<u>Lilies</u>, <u>Poppy Field Trifold</u>, <u>Painting En Plein Air</u>

Materials:

- 4x6 Watercolor Paper
- Watercolors with Paintbrush
- Water Cups (Save for Reuse)

YOU'LL NEED

- Water
- Paper towels

Introduction: Claude Monet:

- Watch this Video from the Tate Museum about Impressionism
- Who was Claude Monet?
 - Founder of Impressionism Monet's painting Impression, Sunrise
 (1872) inspired the name of the Impressionist movement, which
 revolutionized art with its focus on light, color, and loose
 brushstrokes.
 - Loved Painting Outdoors Monet preferred painting en plein air (outside) to capture how light changed throughout the day,

- leading to his famous series paintings like *Haystacks* and *Rouen Cathedral*.
- Created His Own Garden Monet designed and planted the gardens at his home in Giverny, France, which became the inspiration for many of his paintings, including his iconic Water Lilies series.
- Struggled with Vision Later in life, Monet developed cataracts, which altered his color perception. Some of his later paintings have a warmer, reddish hue because of his vision changes.
- Painted the Same Subject Many Times Monet was fascinated by how light and atmosphere changed a scene. He painted the same subject at different times of day and in different seasons, like his series of haystacks, bridges, and water lilies.
- <u>View the Slideshow</u> demonstrating Monet's series of the Houses of Parliament.
- Discuss the images:
 - o How does the sky change throughout the day?
 - o How does the sky change depending on the weather?
 - o Describe the sky when there is a sunset.
 - o Describe the sky on a warm, summer's day.
 - o Describe the sky when there is a storm.

Sky Swatch Watercolor Practice:

- ★ Display the last slide in the Slideshow.
- ★ Give each student a 4x6 piece of watercolor paper.
- \star Have each student choose a time of day, season, and the weather.
- ★ Have the students mix and layer colors to create an Impressionist-style sky featuring their chosen time, season, and weather.
- ★ Encourage dabbing and overlapping colors to create an atmospheric effect.
