## How do I report a case of COVID?

I can confirm that we will be contactable until 8pm on Sunday 20th December and parents should report a positive case via the COVID email <a href="mailto:COVID-results@sandersschool.org.uk">COVID-results@sandersschool.org.uk</a> or ring 07493627279 and we then complete track and trace and notify parents accordingly.

We should be notified of positive cases in students who presented symptoms within 48 hours of being in school and so they should have presented with symptoms before Thursday 17th December at the latest for track and tracing to take place from a school point of view.

If any student only starts to present symptoms from Friday 18th December onwards, then there will not be any track or tracing from a school point of view. The school would ask that we are notified where a student will be isolating into the new term as a result of a positive case so we can mark them accordingly; please email <a href="mailto:COVID-results@sandersschool.org.uk">COVID-results@sandersschool.org.uk</a> to notify us of this.

Year 7 students were invited to write a letter of thanks and appreciation to our school's Hero Raimund Sanders Draper. This work is contributing towards a bigger project they will be competing on our school's and their own personal heroes.

The winning letter was created by Nimra who perfectly sums up the reasons our whole community are grateful for Sanders Draper and his sacrifice.

Dear Sanders Draper,

I don't think I can express in words how thankful I am for your sacrifice. You were so brave and went head-to-head with death to save a school packed with children. You gave up your family and friends for our school. On that fateful day, you were only 29 years old, but saved more than 500 children. I am pleased that our school is named after such an honourable man and without your sacrifice, the school would have been destroyed. You were a true hero with a courageous heart, and I can only imagine what the school could have looked like if you did not give your life away. You displayed both gallantry and hard work which means a lot to us because without these values, our school would not be as special as it is today. We have posters, art on display and even our school symbol is a spitfire. We can only guess what was going through your head when you realised your engine had failed and how you had to make a life changing decision so fast. In your short life, you have proved that not all heroes wear capes.





#### **Key Stage 3 Student Voice**

Key Stage 3 Student Voice decided to connect with the elderly in their community and take part in a national scheme "Classroom to Care Home". This is an initiative to reach out to the elderly and bring them Christmas cheer in these difficult times.

They organised to write 107 Christmas cards and wrap 107 packets of biscuits for the elderly who reside in local care homes. Year 10 students kindly helped out with writing the cards and wrapping the gifts and members of the student voice packed up the biscuits and cards, which were delivered to the care homes on Tuesday. It was a lovely idea and gesture that was much appreciated by the care home owners and has brought some happiness to the elderly of Hornchurch.


