When Tomas discovers a strange old tree at the bottom of his grandfather's garden, he doesn't think much of it. But he takes the funny fruit from the tree back into the house and gets the shock of his life when a tiny dragon hatches. The tree is a dragon fruit tree, and Tomas now has his very own dragon. Hello Flicker! LOS SFPL

e audio Bravelands: Broken Pride, Blood and Bone and two more by Erin Hunter From the author of Warriors, this epic adventure is told from three viewpoints: a lion cast out from his pride, an elephant who can read the bones of the dead, and a baboon rebelling against his destiny. When an unthinkable act shatters the peace, the fragile balance between predators and prey rests in the paws of three unlikely heroes. LOS SFPL

Cardboard Kingdom, Roar of the Beast, and Snow and Sorcery by Chad Sell

Organized and illustrated by Chad Sell, this series brings together multiple authors to tell the stories of a group of neighborhood children who unleash their imaginations to create a fantasy world of superheroes and sorcerers. As the series progresses, we learn more about who these children are in the real world and how this inspires their characters in the titular Cardboard Kingdom. Full of action and drama, this graphic novel has broad appeal.

e audio The Cheshire Cheese Cat: A Dickens of a Tale by Carmen Agra Deedy Hoping to trade London's damp alleyways for the warmth of ye olde Cheshire Cheese Inn, Skilley strikes a bargain with Pip, a clever mouse. Skilley will protect the mice who live at the inn, and the mice will provide the alley-cat with the thing he desires most. But the pair soon find themselves drawn into a mystery that threatens the Inn, the Queen, and their friendship.

### **Cress Watercress** by Gregory Maguire

It's a dangerous world for rabbits so when Papa doesn't return from a honey-gathering trip, the family suspects the worst. The family moves to a basement unit of a run-down oak tree apartment with an owl landlord, a nosy mouse super, rowdy squirrels, and songbirds who broadcast everyone's business. Can a dead tree full of annoying neighbors ever be home?

## Dog Squad by Chris Grabenstein

Duke is not your average dog. Along with his crew, he fights crime and goes on claw-biting adventures helping dogs in peril in the hit streaming sensation--DOG SQUAD! Fred is a pretty average dog. He's scrappy. He's loveable. But he's not brave like his heroes on Dog Squad. When there's danger in real life, can Fred find the courage to step up and save the day?!

## e audio Firstborn by Tor Seidler

Maggie the Magpie is dismayed to learn how silly most of her family are, so she strikes up friendships with other animals including a crow and a wolf. She has a front-row seat to their adventures: bringing down buffalo, raising a litter, avoiding capture, and learning that you must first be loyal to your own nature before you can be loyal to others. ### e Houdini and Me by Dan Gutman

Eleven-year-old Harry Mancini is NOT Harry Houdini—the famous escape artist who died in 1926. But he DOES live in Houdini's old NYC home, and he definitely knows everything there is to know about Houdini's life. What happens when someone starts texting Harry, claiming to be Houdini communicating from beyond the grave? **SFPL** 

e audio The Land of Stories: **The Wishing Spell** and 5 more by Chris Colfer Twins Alex and Conner leave their world behind and enter a foreign land full of wonder and magic where they come face-to-face with fairy tale characters they grew up reading about. But after a series of encounters with witches, wolves, goblins, and trolls, they realize that getting back home is going to be harder than they thought. **LOS SEPL** 

# e audio Love Sugar Magic: Dash of Trouble, Sprinkle of Spirits and A Mixture of Mischief by Anna Meriano

Leonora's family bakery is famous for its treats celebrating the town's *Dia de los Muertos* festival. Leo discovers her family has been keeping a big secret: they're brujas—witches of Mexican ancestry—who pour magic into everything that they bake. Leo is sure she has powers too and decides to try out just one little spell. What could possibly go wrong? LOS SEPL

## Maya and the Robot by Eve L. Ewing

When Maya's two besties are placed in a different fifth grade class, she worries about being alone. The shy girl finds a robot named Ralph in the back of a convenience store closet and uses her science skills to get him up and running. New friendships develop, but Maya soon learns that some people like Ralph for all the wrong reasons.

Max wants to be a knight, but that's highly unlikely in the kingdom of Byjovia, which has all sorts of strange rules and one truly evil ruler: King Gastly. But when Max joins up with a band of adventurers—the Midknights—everything starts to change (mostly for the better). The magic, adventure and hilarity continue in books 2 and 3 of this illustrated series. SFPL

## Once Upon a Camel by Kathi Appelt

Zada won camel races for the royal Pasha of Smyrna, crossed treacherous oceans to new lands, led army missions, and outsmarted a pompous mountain lion. Now, Zada wanders the desert as the last camel in Texas. Two tiny kestrel chicks are nestled in her fur, and a mountain-sized dust storm is taking all of them on one grand adventure.

The Sheep, the Rooster and the Duck: A Tale from the Age of Wonder by Matt Phelan Emile is happy just to be a caretaker at Ben Franklin's Paris château, but then the 10-year-old learns about a sinister plot. Three creatures offer to help him save Franklin and the world, but can he really trust a sheep, a rooster and a duck? Read *Mesmerized* (see *Nonfiction*) to learn more about the real-life characters found in this funny, illustrated story.

Reverend Reese taught high school science—as well as freedom and equality. He led by example, organizing marches in Selma to push for voting rights for African Americans. He believed "If the teachers marched, people would notice, and change would come," Powerful illustrations help show how the actions of everyday citizens can drive change. SFPL
