## Studio Art II: Drawing Curriculum at a Glance

## **Overview**

This course expands on the two-dimensional (2D) elements from Studio Art 1. This course builds expression, development of concept and narrative story-telling on a foundation of strong composition grounded in the Elements of Art and the Principles of Design. Students will further advance their technique in primarily drawing and painting as well as digital media. More emphasis will be placed on the creative processes of compositional design as well as developing an artistic voice and personal expression. This course provides a direct pathway into Advanced Projects.
