I had to wrack my brain to find something. When a class is all about getting you up in front of people, online work is hard to find.

But here's something to get us started. You are going to watch a TV show (or it can be a movie if you'd rather do that) and write a review about it. You will find two worksheets (either attached to this message or under materials on schoolgoy) that will walk you through it. It's pretty basic but I would like for you to really put some thought into what you think worked or didn't work for the show. The show needs to be a scripted show – not a reality show. It can be live people or animation. It can be a current show or a show in syndication (re-runs.) It needs to be at least 20ish minutes long which is the basic length of a sitcom if you take out commercials.
