To help you succeed in this class the following is provided:

COURSE DESCRIPTION:

This course is designed to allow more advanced students interested in learning to play the guitar the opportunity to play more advanced compositions. Emphasis will be placed on reading and understanding more complex musical notation and mastering the more demanding physical techniques needed to perform more challenging musical compositions.

COURSE GOALS:

To identify and interpret more complex note and rest values, pitch, meter signature, and less common rhythmic patterns.

To identify and utilize more complex music terms, tempo markings and styles.

To develop a command of the physical demands of the instrument.

To deepen an awareness of the responsibilities inherent in belonging to a musical organization.

TEXTBOOKS/MATERIALS:

The names of the books we use are "Together We Learn" and "Together We Play". Excerpts from these and other books will be provided to your child at no cost. In addition, students are required to have their own notebook with a pocket for sheet music given out during the year. This music will belong to your child and they will get to keep it after they finish the class.

Although not a requirement of the class, to do well, your child **needs** a guitar at home. There are a number of guitars available in school and I make some of my own guitars available for the children to use. These guitars do not leave the classroom. I have made arrangements with an online musical instrument dealer to provide your child with everything they need to begin studying guitar. Just to be clear. **You are not obligated to purchase this package;** this deal will address all of the instrumental needs your child will have if you do not already have a guitar on hand. Simply go to my class website and click the link to order.

Repair costs due to mishandling of the classroom guitars will be passed along to the students' family.

COURSE FEES:

This year there will be a course fee of \$30.00 for all Fine Arts Programs. Special arrangements can be made if these fees create a hardship for your family on a case-by-case basis. The course fee can be paid via the school store website. Simply go to my class website and click the link to pay these course fees.

REQUIRED PERFORMANCE CLOTHING:

Students in the Intermediate Guitar Class are expected to purchase black shoes and black slacks or long black skirts to wear during performances. I will provide a "Hyde Park Guitar" Polo Shirt that is paid for through your Course Fees.

ABSENCE POLICY:

Students are allowed three school days after the return from a student's absence to request homework. Students will be given at least three days for the assignment to be completed and submitted.

LATE WORK POLICY:

Students may turn in missing assignments up to one week before the end of any grading period. Students will not be penalized for turning in assignments late. Note: Students' Citizenship Grade will be impacted by turning in late assignments. See Citizenship for more information.

ASSESSMENT RETAKE POLICY:

In order to retake an assessment, the student MUST demonstrate an effort to improve their mastery of the content. Once this is reviewed by the teacher, an opportunity will be given to improve the assessment score. The highest score will always remain in the gradebook.

Students must request retake (after the above criteria is completed) at least one week before the end of the grading/quarter period. **Note:** Abuse of the retake policy will result in a parent conference.

EXTRA CREDIT POLICY:

Students can gain extra credit by exceeding 100 minutes of practice in any given week as reflected in their parent initialed practice logs. Late logs do not receive extra credit.

ACADEMIC DISHONESTY POLICY:

Work that is not original will receive no credit. Students will have such work returned with the expectation that their own work will be submitted. Such work will be considered late work and graded as such.

TARDY POLICY:

We will follow the school wide tardy policy. Please see the school website.

WHAT SHOULD A STUDENT DO IF THEY NEED HELP?
