Kevin Farrell Updates:

• Main Street Marywood clarification: Was 100% funded by a donation to the University; tuition did not go to it. Spread the word, and continue to be proud that Marywood students created that area, the architecture students. Hope is to continue to do that for

- different areas, put yourself out there for your departments, advocate for your areas, and let your voices be heard.
- This has been a great update for reports for the first meeting. Even if you haven't met with your mentor, you are bringing up great ideas, and it's a great start to the semester.

Open Floor:

Representatives:

- Logan: General assembly is important still, but a representative's role earns the right to vote. The incentive to be a general member is gone because they can't vote.
- Hudson: voted no, as she is thinking back to how housing meetings are structured for the
 board of a building or complex. Open floor time is before the board votes. If the general
 assembly doesn't have the opportunity to vote, the open floor should be moved to the
 beginning of the meeting so we can hear them before. Publicize the votes we do before
 having them.
- Kevin: This is an opportunity for a small committee to gather to incentivize students to log in to the meetings.
- Sabrina: Understands where people are coming from, but we have yet to have someone log in as a general member.
- Sampson: Understands everyone's perspectives. For general members to have voting rights makes them no different from representatives, except that they don't need to do all the extra work that you do. Representatives earn their right to vote; it's like Congress, where only the congresspeople vote. Someone could not even be paying attention in our meeting and still vote; representatives are educated voters, and we can't assume that of all the general members.
- Dani: respects the separation of power, but general members are losing a lot of things, but not getting things back, no online, and we need more advertising for the general assembly.
- Cate: Maybe 1 vote for the entire general assembly.
- Hudson: email sent out on the 9th, link to the Zoom was at the bottom of the email, could be made more obvious, and we should advertise more.
- Kevin: We can send reminder emails about them, the newsletter, there are ways to get things out there.
- Maurice: Logan, does campus safety still offer shuttle service? Logan: Campus safety is a resource available. If you ever feel unsafe, you can call them and they can shuttle you, but it isn't something to use out of laziness and just want a ride; it's for legitimate reasons for being unsafe. Maurice: Is it for accessibility needs, too? Logan: can be brought up to mentor to see if that is also provided for people who need it.

- Fatou: collaborating with JT, doing a health fair, about stress, nutrition, etc.
- Melanie: Anyone with 5k walks or service-related things, feel free to work with me and collaborate on it.
