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Abstract

The abstract must be clear, concise, and descriptive. It should provide a brief introduction to the legal problem and the objective of the paper, followed by a statement on the research methodology and a brief summary of the results or findings. The abstract must be written in English using Times New Roman (11 pt), single-spaced, and should not exceed 300 words.

Keywords: Keyword 1; Keyword 2; Keyword 3 (Alphabetical order, 2–5 keywords, separated by a semicolon)

A. Introduction (*Times New Roman (11 pt)*)

The introduction must clearly outline the legal issues or problems to be discussed in the manuscript.¹ Authors should provide sufficient background and a brief literature survey to identify existing solutions or methods. It is essential to demonstrate the differences from previous research and highlight the gaps or limitations of prior studies on the same topic. Authors must clearly state the scientific contribution or the novelty of this paper. The introduction should end with a comment on the importance of the problem identification and the research objective.²

B. Research Method

This section is written descriptively and must provide a clear statement regarding the research methodology used. It should give readers an idea of the approach (e.g., normative, empirical, or comparative) and the legal materials utilized. This section is optional for original research articles.³

C. Result and Discussion

This is the most important part of your article. The result and discussion must be clear, concise, and analytical. The results should summarize the scientific findings and provide data briefly. Authors must highlight the differences between their results/findings and previous publications by other researchers. All discussions must be supported by appropriate citations in the form of footnotes using the **Chicago Manual of Style 17th Edition (Full Note)**.

1. Sub-heading of the discussion

Authors are encouraged to use sub-headings to organize the analysis logically.

2. Sub-heading of the discussion

All Tables and Figures must be centrally aligned on the page, with the corresponding data source cited directly beneath the object. To ensure high-quality print production, figures must be clearly legible and maintain a minimum resolution of 300 DPI (Dots Per Inch). Furthermore, tables should be constructed using the 'open model' format, which excludes vertical lines and utilizes only horizontal borders for clarity.
