# SYLLABUS: OBJECTIVES, EXPECTATIONS AND GRADING

#### I. VISION STATEMENT

To create great musical moments with technical excellence and heart, forming a deeper sense of human connection.

Members of this community are committed to the development of musical excellence in every form with passion, integrity, and leadership. This is a **performance-based class**. The material covered and the literature studied are directly related to this end and **attendance at all performances is mandatory for course credit and is of the highest importance**.

## **II. CLASS DESCRIPTION**

This ensemble is audition-only and prior musical experience is required. Students in this ensemble are those who are curious about choral music and committed to improving their vocal skill for themselves and the betterment of the entire choral program. It is a **co-curricular class**, meaning that instruction occurs during the school day as well as on occasional nights and weekends.

#### III. EXPECTATIONS

- Punctual attendance to all rehearsals
  - Tardies are disruptive and interrupt the progress of your learning and that of other students. Be sure to come to class on time, ready to learn. Tardiness will be addressed in accordance with school policy as specified in the DVHS Student Handbook.
- Students will learn how to and improve on their sight singing skills using a variety of in person and online resources.
- Assessments will take place during formal and informal performances. Assessments will also include group projects, individual recordings, and quizzes.
- Students will actively participate in direct instruction and sectional rehearsals to improve their own musicianship.
- No food, drinks or candy/gum allowed during rehearsal with the exception of water.
- NO CELL PHONES DURING REHEARSAL UNLESS GIVEN INSTRUCTOR PERMISSION FOR AN ASSIGNMENT OR ACTIVITY.
- All students will be prepared with their music in a folder (provided) and their own pencil.

## IV. STUDENT BEHAVIORS WHICH AFFECT EARNED GRADE

A. **Concert Attendance** - A missed live performance cannot be made up.

Every student is expected to participate and perform in every concert. Performances are the culmination of many hours of practice and classroom rehearsal. They are like summative assessments (finals) for the individual, but performances also represent a team effort. Any exception must be worked out, **IN WRITING** through a hand-written note, signed by a parent (and/or coach) with the director **AT LEAST TWO WEEKS PRIOR** to the event. Only severe illness and school or religious conflicts will be considered for an excused absence from a required or scheduled event with adequate communication with the director. Concerts include performances, festivals, and competitions. Students who miss a concert or required event for an excused reason will receive a make-up assignment when the director receives the written notice. Unexcused absences or No Shows will result in a gradebook zero.

### **B.** Participation

Students are expected to actively participate in all rehearsals, utilize sectional time and class time wisely, and complete assignments with academic integrity by the indicated due date. Should a student be unable to do any of the above for any reason, the student needs to clearly communicate their situation with the teacher in a timely fashion.

## **Gum Chewing/Eating**

Gum and eating are not allowed during any rehearsal. It interferes with good vocal technique and is a choking hazard. First offense will result in a warning and all subsequent occurrences will result in a reduction in participation points.

## **C.** Performance Uniforms

Returning choir members will be wearing uniforms coordinated and organized by the music director and the DVHS music boosters. It is the student's responsibility to wear the appropriate concert attire for their performing group during performances. Concert attire specifications will be outlined at the New Family Night as well as Back to School Night for students new to the choir program. It is the responsibility of each student to properly maintain their uniform including cleaning, pressing and mending. Students are also expected to be neatly groomed for performances. Make-up should be used tastefully. Small post style earrings are accepted. Students will receive assigned points for their uniform and grooming at all concerts and may not be allowed to perform if they do not meet the stated standards of the ensemble uniform.

### V. OVERVIEW OF GRADING

## 30 % Concert Responsibilities

Includes promptness and preparedness at concert events as well as other responsibilities (set up, take down, tech rehearsal, etc.).

## 30 % Participation and Attitude

Determined by the student's rehearsal preparation and actions while in rehearsals, performances, field trips, sectionals and while working with other students.

## 15 % Class Work/Assignments/Special Projects

Includes musicianship lessons or other assignments such as costume preparation, uniform checks, permission slips, etc.

## 10 % Gigs & Pod Projects

This includes all off campus performances such as community concerts and special community performances. Recorded performances utilizing current audio and visual technology in assigned small groups will be required in the spring semester.

### 15% Part Check Quizzes

These singing samples will be given at least once each quarter either recorded or live. Graded areas include note accuracy, tone quality, diction, memorization, etc.

### **Academic Ethics**

<u>Cheating/Plagiarism/Violation of test procedures</u> will not be tolerated. Violations of academic ethics will be addressed according to the DVHS Student Handbook.
