I will hold you responsible at the outset of the semester to demonstrate your mastery of these words, so be prepared to be assessed on these words when we meet in the Fall. The level of vocabulary on the AP test questions and the texts we will be exploring is *very* advanced, so it's important that we develop our lexicon to the highest degree.

- 2) Throughout the summer you should also use the following Quizlet Link to study the 116 Literary Devices and Terms that I expect my scholars to know:

 Many of these terms you already know, as you have learned them since elementary school. Others may require some review or meticulous studying. You will become an advanced literary scholar. This link can also be found on my website: It's imperative that you practice using Quizlet's variety of learning activities from flash cards, to practice tests, to games. Don't be daunted by the number of or sophistication of these terms. I assure you that when you couple your studies with the resources, games and practice that I will give you throughout the year, you will master these terms. There will be an assessment on these terms when you return in the Fall.
- 3) As summer comes to a close, about a week before class begins, I want you to purchase and read When the Emperor was Divine by Julie Otsuka. I have also provided you with a slideshow on this novel, that I think you will find extremely beneficial. I can't impress upon you enough how imperative it is that you have your own copies of each book we read in class so that you can properly annotate all readings. However, if you absolutely need a copy of this novel, see me <u>before</u> the summer break. Be prepared to discuss and write about this excellent novel before we meet in August. Again, you probably shouldn't begin reading this book until a week before classes resume, so that the book remains fresh in your minds.

For those of you feeling particularly ambitious, trainers at the College Board highly recommend students purchase, *Cliff Notes' AP English Literature and composition 3rd Editions* by Allan Casson Ph.D. This is an excellent resource for preparing for the rigors of this exam. You should definitely practice on your own using this resource throughout your senior year.

Furthermore, know that I am available starting today, via in person, email, phone or text to help you learn any of the aforementioned vocabulary, literary terms or discuss the novel. 303 815-0269

Finally, now is the perfect time to start setting money aside for the AP examination which is 95 dollars. Checks should be made out to LHS.
