Course Name: World Language - Grade 7

### **Course Description:**

The seventh grade World Language Curriculum includes four units of study: Soccer: The Unofficial Sport of the World, Dining Around the World, Implications of Colonialism on Spanish Speaking Countries, and Mass Media, Marketing, and Popular Culture. These units of study address the themes of health, wellness, and nutrition, global awareness and contemporary life, language and regional variations, leisure and recreation, and explorations, colonialism, and revolutions. Students at this level are working on developing the skills needed to speak in spontaneous and unrehearsed situations. Through the domains of language control, vocabulary, communication strategies, and cultural awareness, students will work on their ability to understand others and be understood. By the end of seventh grade, the goal is for students to attain a level of proficiency of Novice High in the core modes of communication of interpretive listening and reading, interpersonal communication, and presentational speaking and writing. Students at the Novice High level are able to use memorized phrases and vocabulary to join strings of words or simple sentences together to communicate.

#### **Course Proficiencies:**
