

PRESENTER RULES & GUIDELINES:

1. Claim Your Spot:

You must sign up in advance to pitch, whether you're pitching your single queer friend, your friend group, or yourself. Spots are limited, so even if your presentation isn't ready yet, grab your spot early. Signing up doesn't guarantee a slot; you'll get an email once your pitch is officially confirmed. If all spots are full, you'll see WAITLIST. Feel free to join it, and we'll reach out if a spot opens up.

2. Bring Your Bestie:

Whoever is being pitched (friend, friend group, or you) must know about it, agree to it, and be present during the event. No surprise pitches. We keep it fun, respectful, and consensual at all times.

✨ Bonus: Anyone being pitched can join you on stage if they want! Walk, strut, wave, pose, or reveal. If they'd rather stay seated, that's totally fine too. They'll still get all the love.

3. Keep It Cute, Not Shady:

This is about uplifting, hyping, and celebrating. No roasting, no mess, no backhanded compliments. Just good vibes and genuine love.

4. No Nudity:

Be creative, be bold — but keep it PG-13. No nudity or explicit content.

5. Props Are Encouraged!

Bring fun props that help tell the story of who you're pitching. Get creative! Just no weapons or anything unsafe.

6. Canva Only, Please:

All presentations must be created in Canva. It keeps things consistent and cute! There's a free version available for everyone, and you can even try a free trial of Canva Pro if you want to use premium templates or elements.

7. No Fancy-Pants Animations:

Sorry, folks, no over-the-top animations or transitions. We're just sliding from one slide to the next. If you want something to appear, break it into separate slides. Keep it simple.

8. Make It Legible:

If there's text, it better be BIG. We want the folks in the back to see it too. Here's the minimum font size, depending on your software (but remember, you're using Canva!):

- Canva: 75

9. Practice, Practice, Practice:

Make sure to rehearse your pitch a few times before the event! Running

through it out loud will help calm your nerves, refine your delivery, and ensure you hit all the key points that make your friend shine.

10. 3-5 Minutes, Tops:

You've got 3-5 minutes to give us life! Keep it snappy, but be as imaginative as you want. Be sure to include the pitcher's preferred pronouns, sexual orientation, and age.

11. Don't Forget the Last Slide Highlight:

Each pitch is 3-5 minutes. Be sure to include:

- Preferred pronouns
- Sexual orientation
- Age
- What they're looking for (friends, lovers, community, etc.)

12. Submit Your Presentation On Time:

Once you're approved to pitch, you'll get details in your confirmation email about when to submit your presentation and where to send it. Make sure your file name is clear, like *"ALEX pitched by Jane."*

13. Need to Bail? Let Us Know, Boo:

Plans change, we get it! If you need to cancel your pitch, give us a heads-up ASAP so someone else can jump in. No hard feelings!

FAQ's:

What is the average number of pitches presented a night?	6-12
Can I pitch with another friend?	Yes, we allow up to two presenters for each pitch.
Do I have to be queer to pitch my friend?	No. Allies are welcome to pitch their queer besties. If you're pitching yourself, you must identify as LGBTQIA+.
How old do you have to be to attend and participate?	This is a 21+ event.
Can I make changes to the presentation after sending it to the hosts?	You can make changes up to 48 hours before the event. After that, we do not allow adjustments.
Can I pitch myself if I don't have someone to pitch me?	Yes. You can pitch yourself to find love or friendship as long as you identify as LGBTQIA+.
Is the person being pitched supposed	Yes! The person you are pitching should

to/allowed to attend?	be in attendance.
Does the presenter have to be single?	If the presenter is pitching their single queer friend, they do not have to be single. If the presenter is also the person being pitched, the presenter can be single, poly, or in an open relationship as long as their relationship status is disclosed in the presentation.
Can my friend and I pitch each other at the same event if we are both single?	Yes! Friends can pitch each other at the same event.
Can people who are polyamorous or in open relationships be pitched?	Yes. We simply ask that everyone pitching & being pitched is transparent about their relationship status during the presentations to ensure a comfortable and respectful experience for everyone involved.
