International students often pay more per credit hour than domestic students. Can you justify why? What are the increased costs for having international students on campus?	Summarize why low-income families may not use financial institutions in ways that would benefit them. What solutions can you suggest?
Your work team has been teasing the female safety officer in a way that seems sexually suggestive. What should you do?	A team member leaves for religious services and takes a long lunch hour every Friday. The team is complaining about it behind his back. What should you do?
While working in an assisted living center, you are told that only women are to care for the patient in room 214 due to the preferences of her family and husband, but you (as a male) are the only one available and she needs to use the bathroom. What are you going to do?	As a new earth science teacher, you are questioned by a parent about teaching evolution vs creationism. How do you handle this very delicate situation?
You are paired with a coworker whose native language is not English. Though you can usually understand her, she often gets very quiet and talks much more quickly when under stress. This makes her much more difficult to understand. The pair of you are tasked with creating an estimate for a project and then presenting it to a new client your new boss is trying to land. How can you make working together productive?	A colleague has had a vacation approved for four weeks to travel back to his country of origin because his Mom needs surgery and he must help out. He is an important member of the team and will be missing key deadlines during his travel. The office hasn't made any accommodations for his absence, so the team needs to cover his work. What course of action can you initiate?
