FEDERAL PROGRAMS

Delta County School District (DCSD) supports district improvement efforts funded under the Elementary and Secondary Education Act (ESEA). ESEA is the primary federal law affecting K-12 education. The main goal of ESEA is to help all students reach proficiency in English Language Arts/reading and mathematics.

The majority of federal programs support specific populations of students, including students struggling with reading and math, low-income families, homeless students, and students with specific needs who do not qualify for services under Special Education.

The priorities of each school are based on each school's needs assessment and improvement plan. Each school has a parent accountability group to support the school's improvement. Please contact the school for more information.

Every Student Succeeds Act (ESEA) Title Funding

There are multiple Title programs and each program has its own focus.

Title I - Improving the Academic Achievement of Students

Title I, Part A of ESEA is the largest federal program supporting public education. Title I funding provides resources to ensure all students reach challenging academic standards, specifically in reading and mathematics. Title I has requirements about how the money is dispersed and used in schools. Eligibility for Title I funding is based on statutory formulas.
