



National Honor Society Eligibility Guidelines

The Pulaski chapter of the National Honor Society selection criteria is established to recognize students who demonstrate excellence in the areas of Scholarship, Leadership, Service and Character. The selection process takes place each year in the fall. Chapters of the NHS nationwide set criteria specific to their school. It is a good idea to keep this criteria in mind as you plan your academic schedule beginning in your freshman year.

Scholarship

Eligible junior and senior members must have a cumulative grade point average of 3.65 or higher in order to be invited to pursue membership. Also, they must have completed, or are currently enrolled in, at least two of the following courses: Advanced Placement (AP) in any subject area, Advanced English, Advanced Math, Chemistry, Physics, Dual Credit or World Language level III or higher.

Service

Students must be able to show 20 hours of accumulated community service documented on their application form. Students with less than 20 hours will not be considered. An additional 60 hours or more will be required and will need to be documented after induction. (30 hours junior year and 30 hours senior year).

Leadership & Character

Students invited to seek membership are required to write a short essay providing personal examples of good character and strong leadership skills. Essays and a formal list of extracurricular involvements are reviewed by a faculty committee for induction purposes. No student will be considered who has had an academic, athletic, or community code violation during their high school career beginning with their freshman year.
