 Clarifications: This standard begins in grade five. Students analyze the similarities and differences in stories of the same genre (e.g., mysteries, adventure stories) focusing on how they explore a variety of themes and topics. It is common for stories to have multiple themes. Themes or topics can be explicitly or implicitly presented.
