Topic: Adolescence

Describe the physical, cognitive, and ideological changes that characterize adolescence.

Describe research related to the sexual attitudes and roles of adolescence.

Outline the process by which adolescents find a personal identity.

Describe the role of family and peers during adolescence.

Describe the difference between gender identity and gender role.

Describe gender differences in personality and cognitive abilities.

Topic: Adulthood and Old Age

Describe the physical, social, and emotional changes that occur during adulthood.

Identify changes that occur during old age.

Summarize how people physically, mentally, and socially adjust to old age.

Identify the stages of dying.

Describe the services of hospice.

Analyze your own personal lifeline with past, present and predictions of your future.

Describe the parts and functions of the nervous system.

Identify the structure and function of the human brain and the ways to study the brain.

Define and discuss threshold, Weber's Law, and signal detection.

Describe the nature and functioning of the sense organs.

Outline the principles involved in perception.

Describe how we learn to perceive and what illusions are.

Describe the four theories of motivation.

Discuss the difference between intrinsic and extrinsic motivation.

Explain Maslow's hierarchy of needs.

Give examples of psychological theories of emotion.

Topic: States of Consciousness

Describe the research related to sleep and dreams.

List and discuss sleep disorders.

Describe research into hypnosis, biofeedback and meditation.

Topic: Learning

Describe the principles of classical conditioning and outline the techniques of classical conditioning.

Outline the principles of operant conditioning and describe the applications of operant conditioning.

Cite the principles involved in cognitive learning, modeling, and behavior modification.

Explain the three processes of memory and describe the information-processing model of memory.

Define psychological disorders.

Distinguish between the concept of normality and abnormality.

Describe schizophrenia and the theories to explain mood disorders.

Differentiate personality and psychological disorders.

Explain psychotherapy and the role of a therapist.
