2. Materials and Methods, or Methods

Materials and Methods, or Method is no more than 25% of total page. Material and method consist of materials and tools, measurement methods, processes, research design, variables, and data analysis. Method consists of sampling method and analytical method (can be presented in flow chart).

Equations should be typed with indent 2.00 pt and numbered consecutively starting with (1) set flush right. For numbering, use ordered numbers (1), (2), (3), and so on. Meanwhile, for referring an Equation in the body text, please use "Equation (1)".

1.1. **Heading 2**

Sub chapter title (heading 2) written with capital letters on the first letter of each word, left aligned and bold.

3. **Results and Discussion**

Explains theoretical and empirical findings, including the comparison with previous studies and shows the contribution to the field of science. The size is no more than 50% of the total page. Results can be presented in figures and/or tables.

1.2. **Table**

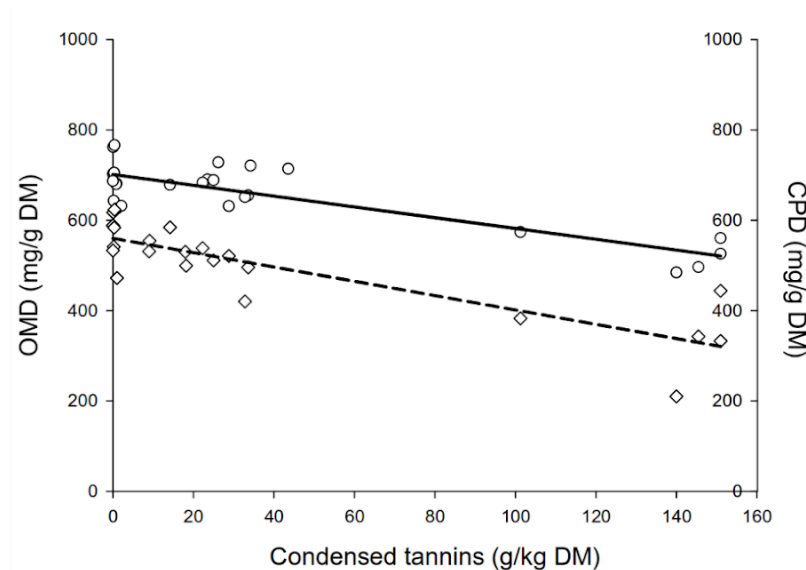


Figure 1. Titles are placed under the pictures and graphs. It should be capitalized for every letter of the word picture title with Arabic number as the picture and graph numbers

All tables should be referred in the text and avoid repeating similar table information in the text. Table title is placed above the table, it should be concise and clearly describe content of the table. All figures and tables should be centered and numbered consecutively. Use the Figure and Table Style for every description of a figure and table respectively. For referring a figure and table in the body text, please use “Figure 1” and “Table 1” respectively.

Tables are written with Times New Roman font size 11. The title of the table is written with font size 11 above the table without blank space. The table is numbered in Arabic numerals. There is one single space line between the table and the paragraph. The table is placed immediately after it is referred to in the text. The frame of the table uses 1 font-size line. If the title in each table column is long and complex, the columns are numbered and the notes are given below the table.

Graphic contents are placed symmetrically on the page and there is one blank single space line between the graphic content and the paragraphs. A graphic content is placed immediately after it is referred to in the body of the text and is numbered in Arabic numerals. Caption for the graphic content is written below it and there is one blank single space line between it and the graphic content. The caption is written in font size 11, and placed as in the example. Between the graphic content with the body of the text there are one blank single space lines.

Acknowledgments (optional), is gratitude to persons and/or parties who have supported the research, both in funding/facilities and thoughts.. Acknowledgments are written at the end of the text before the Reference, not as the footnote of the article title.
