Late Work Policy:

- You may hand in homework up to one school- day late at a 10% penalty. I will accept no late work after one day.
- You may hand in projects late, but you will lose one letter grade each school- day the work is late

Absenteeism Policy:

If you are present the day I assign a task, but are absent the day the work is due, you must hand in the work the day you return to class. If you are absent the day I assign a task, you have five pre-session days to complete the task.

Formal Writing and Turnitin Similarity Index:

Submissions with more than a 35% similarity index will result in one of the following outcomes, depending on the assignment and the nature of the similarity:

- One letter grade reduction
- Zero
- Disciplinary action

Homework and Turnitin Similarity Index:

The similarity index for homework assignments does not factor into your assignment score; however, if portions of submissions, outside of a properly cited text, are marked similar to an electronic or print resource as well as another student's work, you will get no points for the assignment.
