Analyzing Visuals: The OPTIC Strategy AP English

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The painting that you are about to look at contains a significant number of details that, when considered together, convey some interesting ideas. Paying attention to the details is a habit that is a necessary part of effective analysis. As you look at the painting, please use the **OPTIC** strategy to construct meaning from the art. **OPTIC** stands for **Overview**, **Parts**, **Title**, **Interrelationship**, and **Conclusion**. As you look at the painting, respond to each element:

- 1. **O** Write a brief *overview* of the painting.
- 2. **P** Key in on all of the *parts* by noting any details that seem important. This can be anything: color, figures, textures, scenery, whatever.
- 3. **T** Use the *title* to clarify the subject of the painting.
- 4. **I** Specify the *interrelationships* in the painting. In other words, how are the parts related both to one another and the painting as a whole.
- 5. **C** Draw a *conclusion* about the painting as a whole.
