

Meet Marshal Duties Defined

UPON ARRIVAL: Meet Marshals SHOULD

- Be on the pool deck 15 min prior to the start of Warm Ups
- Report to the Meet Referee to discuss preferred meet marshal positioning (based on the number of MM) and the warm up guidelines
- Locate first aid equipment, know who first aid marshal is and where they are located
- Locate Emergency Action Plan to be able to participate as needed in the event of an emergency
- Review the EAP and a copy of the In Case of Emergency Quick Reference Guide if available to be familiar with emergency response chain of command
- Communicate with the lifeguards as needed

DURING THE WARM UP SESSIONS AND MEET Meet Marshals SHOULD:

- Make sure they have the appropriate LSC approved attire: usually a neon orange or yellow vest
- Stay focused on the pool at all times
- Remind anyone using a phone, camera, or recording device behind the block to put it away
- Ensure that all non- athletes on the deck have the appropriate wrist band and are authorized to be there
- Perform locker rooms sweeps as planned by the meet host and ONLY with another person of the same gender. Do not enter the athlete locker room facility alone
- Notify the Meet Referee and Meet Director immediately if any safety or safe sport complaints are communicated to them

Meet Marshals SHOULD NOT:

- Be on cell phones
- Address safe sport or safety complaints directly through confronting individuals
- Leave the assigned or designated position unattended, even briefly
- Enter the locker room/athlete areas alone
