IMPORTANT REMINDERS FOR ALL EDUCATORS

- 120 in-service education points are needed during each 5-year validity period in order to renew teaching certification.
 - o Of the 120 points earned, 40 of those points must be toward Reading and 20 more must be toward ESE/SWD.
 - Courses identified as Reading/SWD 40 will satisfy the point requirements of both Reading and ESE/SWD.
 - For those with Educational Leadership certification, **20** points must also be earned toward **Educational Leadership**.
- It is the responsibility of individual educators, not FLDOE or school districts, to maintain and ensure certification renewal.
- Points are not automatically awarded, reported, or added to FLDOE, school districts, or ACPS ACIIS transcripts. Read On!

Day 1 Session - 6 Points Virtual Sessions - 2 Points each Counts Toward Reading 40 and SWD MRIE - <u>Making Reading Instruction Explicit For Students with Persistent Reading Difficulties - Overview, Vocabulary, Comprehension, and Fluency</u>

Create explicit reading instruction that helps students with persistent reading difficulties make reading gains. Participants examine practice profiles from Just Read, Florida! Design explicit instruction lessons that include evidence-based strategies to support students with on-going difficulties with foundational reading skills!

This course is delivered by FDLRS in one full-day first session and 4 follow-up topic sessions for 2-3 hours each. Day 1 provides an overview of reading and the teaching of reading explicitly. Follow-up topic sessions include fluency, vocabulary, and comprehension. Phonics is not offered due to district-wide implementation of UFLI Foundations. After attending Day 1, participants can attend all of the follow-up topic sessions *or* individual topic sessions appropriate for individual preferences and/or needs for professional growth and development.
