



Outdoor Contact Sports Opt-In Form

This form is to be used by a school located in a county designated as High Risk or Extreme Risk to notify of its intent to opt in to offer outdoor contact sports for the 2020-21 school year in accordance with the Governor's February 10, 2021 update to [Outdoor Contact Sports Guidance](#). Once final, this form will be posted to a school or district website and a link to it will then be sent to ODE.

In Lower Risk and Moderate Risk counties, practices and games for outdoor contact sports, including high school football, can resume following health and safety guidance to be issued by the Oregon Health Authority.

In High Risk and Extreme Risk counties, where COVID-19 remains more widespread, schools and other sports organizations can opt-in to resuming outdoor full contact sports with additional protocols in place. In such counties, sports organizations must offer on-site responsive testing for symptomatic individuals and close contacts, contact information for contact tracing, and a waiver identifying health and safety risks and a commitment to isolation and quarantine if exposed to COVID-19. Schools in Extreme and High Risk counties must also have at least limited in-person instruction occurring, with the goal of achieving hybrid or full in-person instruction for students this school year. Schools must also be in compliance with state guidance for COVID-19 testing.

Plan Details for School Instructional Model

Beginning January 1, 2021, the Health Metrics for Returning to In-Person Instruction shifted from a mandatory requirement to advisory recommendations. This allows local schools to collaborate with staff, local public health authorities, and the community to consider a number of factors to make local determinations on when it is appropriate to shift to in-person instruction through an On-Site or Hybrid Instructional Model.

While the metrics are now recommendations only, there are important considerations Redmond School District took into account to ensure a consistent and stable learning environment.

Redmond School district is currently in both CDL and Hybrid Model. Beginning February 22nd Elementary school students will have the option to stay in Full-Time On-line or return to in-person learning. Beginning March 1st, elementary school students' in-person option will be 5 day per week with a shortened Wednesday schedule.

Middle school students will have the option of remaining in full time online learning, or can participate in their school's hybrid learning model. In the hybrid model, students are on site two days a week and learn remotely three day per week.

High school students will have the option of remaining in full time online learning, or can participate in their school's hybrid learning model. In the hybrid model, students are on four days a week for half days. One day a week is fully comprehensive distance learning.

On-Site Testing for Symptomatic Individuals and Close Contacts

OHA Requirements

- The school must offer on-site responsive testing for symptomatic individuals and those with known exposures to individuals with COVID-19. This applies to athletes and support staff and volunteers. Schools must also be in compliance with state guidance for COVID-19 testing.

Plan Details for On-Site Testing for Symptomatic Individuals and Close Contacts

RSD will offer Binaxnow covid testing at all of our school sites. Each site has an assigned administrator and recorder as well as a back-up administrator. These personnel will have all had the Binaxnow training. The district has obtained the CLIA waiver and is aware of the standing orders held by the OHA. Tests will

be stored in the nurse office in each building. Administrators will do the testing in the isolation rooms. Tests of students will be performed only with a signed consent. Tests are self-administered. Tests of staff may be performed with verbal consent. All tests will be recorded in the OHA portal. A log will also be kept of all tests performed. All positive tests will be reported to the local public health department. Tests will be offered to symptomatic persons currently on campus and to persons with known exposure to covid on the advice of our local health department. At this time our local health department does not approve of rapid testing to shorten a quarantine period.

Plan Details for Contact Information for Contact Tracing

All individuals (including participants, coaches, officials, staff members and spectators) for each outdoor contact sports practice and contest is to complete an electronic contact tracing form prior to arriving for in person practice, events, contests, etc. For each date the program operates in person, the head coach, or assigned delegate, of each program is responsible for ensuring all individuals complete the form. Student-Athlete Waiver

OHA Requirements

- The school must have a waiver completed for each student-athlete prior to outdoor contact sports participation identifying health and safety risks and a commitment to isolation and quarantine if exposed to COVID-19.

Plan Details for Student-Athlete Waiver

Football players at the high school level will receive the waiver from their coaches and be required to turn the form back into the coach who will deliver it to the building athletic director.
