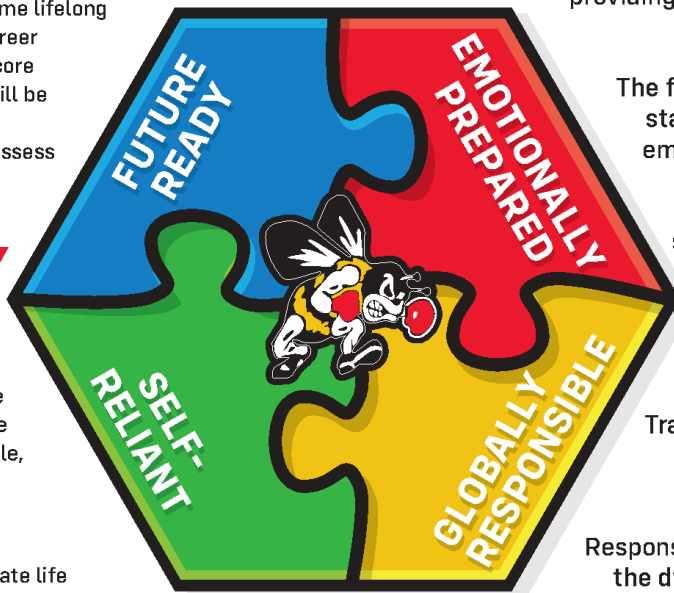

Scope and Sequence of Knowledge and Skills to Be Learned

Sixth Grade

Overview: In this nine-week class, students will be exposed to a full range of art experiences and will create unique works using the Elements and Principles of Design. Fundamental drawing skills will include perspective, pattern, proportion, observational drawing, abstraction, and imaginary drawing. Students will explore the basics of watercolor painting, mixed media, clay sculpture, and portrait proportions.

Materials:

Graphite, colored pencils, crayons, oil pastels, watercolor, clay, markers, mixed media.

Assessments.: Creating with imagination. Drawing Skills: Drawing from observation, Proportion, Depth Perception, Portraiture, Stylized/ Abstraction, Symbolism.

Sculpture: Ceramic clay hand-building skills, Disciplinary literacy in Art, Art Appreciation.

Seventh Grade**Overview:**

Students will be exposed to a variety of art experiences in this trimester class.. They will create unique and imaginative works using the Elements of art and Principles of Design. Fundamental drawing skills will include perspective, pattern, paying attention to detail, observational drawing, stylized/abstract, and imaginary drawing. Students are encouraged to create works from their own experiences that are inventive and imaginative. Students will have the opportunity to spend more time on a ceramic clay project and more advanced handbuilding skills. Art appreciation, art history, discipline literacy, and interdisciplinary connections will be a part of every art unit.

Materials: Clay, glazes, graphite, colored pencils, markers, oil pastels, soft pastels,

watercolor/ acrylics/ and or tempera, sharpie markers, mixed media, foam or collagraph printing plates, printing inks.

Assessments: Creating with imagination. Drawing Skills: Drawing from observation, Proportion, One-Point linear perspective, Portraiture, Stylized/ Abstraction, Symbolism. Sculpture: ceramic clay hand-building skills and glazing techniques., disciplinary literacy in art, art appreciation/ art history.

Eighth Grade

Overview

<p>Studio Art</p> <p>Course Description: Students will have the opportunity to build on what they learned in previous grades and go further in the visual arts. Art projects will be advanced as we explore a variety of art media and apply the elements of art and principles of design. Students will be inspired by works of art past and present. This important art course will lay the foundation for students who want to take high school art.</p> <p>Materials: Clay, Glazes, Soft Pastels, Colored Pencils, Watercolor, Mixed Media Supplies, Printing Inks, Indian Ink.</p> <p>Assessments:/skills: Drawing skills, ceramic sculpture, Handbuilding Clay Skills, Printmaking, Mixed Media, Watercolor painting, Colored Pencils, Pastels Drawing Techniques, Art Appreciation.</p>	<p>Painting & Printmaking</p> <p>Course Description: This semester-long specialty class is for students who are interested in exploring a range of painting and printmaking techniques. Drawing basics, compositional studies and color theory lead the way to expressive abstract acrylic paintings. Gelli prints, monotypes, and linoleum block prints expand printmaking skills. Students gain confidence in 2D design concepts that are used in high school and beyond.</p> <p>Materials: Charcoal, graphite, acrylic paint, watercolor, pastels, colored pencils, printing ink, gelli plates, and linoleum.</p> <p>Assessments/ Skills: Drawing skills, color theory, painting techniques, composition strategies, (2D design), disciplinary literacy in art, critique, art appreciation, art history, and cultural awareness.</p>
