Clinton Township & Lebanon Boro

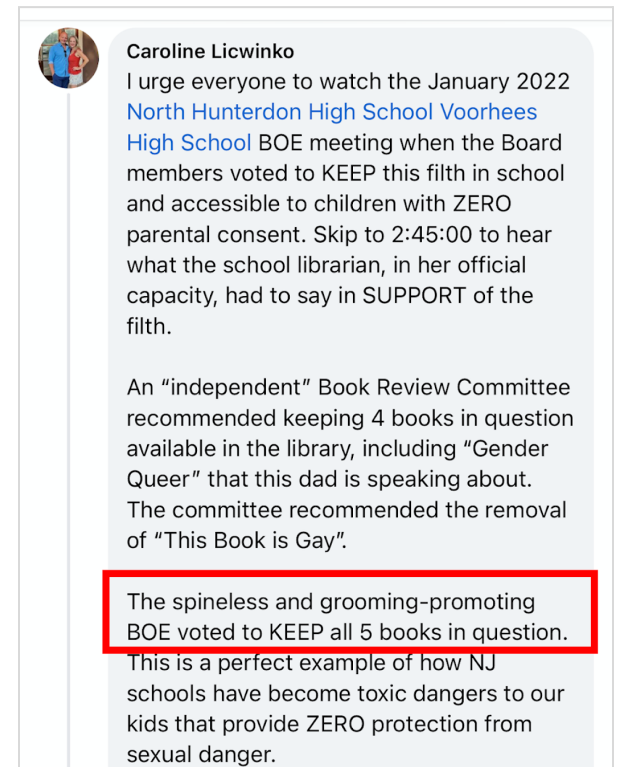
