This is an opportunity to highlight the value of mutual aid in a crisis, to:

- Amplify mutual aid right now to help #FlattenTheCurve and keep more people alive and thriving, and
- Hold up all of the examples of mutual aid as a way to make clear that (and how) it is available to us all of the time. We are far wealthier and more powerful than we often tell ourselves.

Mutual aid is spontaneous.

Mutual aid builds on existing networks and nexuses of trust, and builds new networks and nexuses of trust.

Mutual aid benefits greatly from leaderful organization - those who take

leadership early, lead in a way that recognizes and draws out leadership from everyone, and centers the most appropriate leadership depending on context. (I have not been good at this here, getting better. --John)

You can probably give blood! Most blood drives have been canceled, but blood is still needed and they are set up to do it as safely as possible.

In most areas there are mutual aid groups on Facebook, and other places you can find to volunteer to help deliver meals to people who cannot go out. On some local subreddits people post about these things. You could also try the #mutualaid hashtag on social media that do hashtags.

If you have friends/acquaintances who are not yet taking it seriously, you can consider what might help them look at it another way. Many just haven't thought out yet how even if they're not at risk, their carefulness can save others' lives. Or they hadn't heard yet that Idris Elba has it, or whichever celebrity will get their attention.

Support Asian (esp. Chinese) businesses, racism is really hurting many of them right now.

If you are already prepared or taken care of with food, first aid supplies, etc. think about who may not be and how you can help them.
