

# **Familial Trafficking**

Risk Factors & Red Flags

## CONSTELLATION OF WARNING SIGNS

Familial trafficking is one of the most severe forms of child victimization known to our country. These crimes have a pervasive impact on the child, altering their development and life trajectory. There is a need for multiple red flags in order to fully understand that a person and their situation are indicative of familial trafficking. Can you think of individuals who might be vulnerable to being taken advantage of by a family member?

## **COGNITIVE & COMMUNICATION**

- Memory deficits, attention deficits, learning disabilities, developmental delays, autism spectrum disorder
- Difficulty recounting personal narrative
- Difficulty identifying preferences
- Difficulty making decisions
- Difficulty communicating needs & asking for help
- Intermittent difficulty recalling daily-life experiences

## **EMOTIONAL**

- Angry outbursts
- Self-harm (cutting, burning, head banging, nail biting, hair pulling, skin picking)
- Difficulty coping with change & rigid thinking
- Sleep disturbances (over sleeping, difficulty falling/staying asleep, nightmares)
- Anxiety & phobias (separation, general, specific)
- Fear of specific time of day; day of the week or month; time of year or holiday
- Suicidality
- Eating disorder (under or over eating; purging; pica)
- Generalized sense of unsafety & impending doom
- Seemingly underreaction or flat affect when under stress
- Seemingly overreaction to non-stressful events
- Inability to name complex emotional states
- Hypervigilance/preoccupation with safety or seemingly unaware of danger

- Depend on others for validation and to reflect self-confidence
- Perfectionism
- Obsessive Thinking / Ruminating

## SOCIAL

- Isolation
- Loss of pets (pass away, given away)
- Frequent travel, including being transported from the home late at night
- Virtual learning and homeschooling
- School & district hopping
- Irregular school attendance and/or frequent tardiness
- Lack of community involvement (extra curricular activities)
- Difficulty forming and keeping friends
- Aversion to being photographed
- Bullied or bullying
- Aversion (or lack of enthusiasm) to parent, family member, or guardian
- \* Aversion to using bathroom or being in small spaces with a closed door
- Age-inappropriate sexual knowledge, behavior, or language
- Casual discussion or play surrounding severe violence
- Rule oriented

## PHYSICAL

- Overly sensitive gag reflex
- Heightened startle response
- Lack of emergency care & delayed presentation to medical staff; overall health care avoidance, particularly mental health
- Hygiene neglect (typical with parent drug abuse)
- Habitual intake of cold and allergy medication (over use & inappropriate use); off label use of psychoactive medications
- Fatigue
- \* Rocking & stomach complaints particularly when toileting
- Somatization & vague physical complaints including fatigue, stomach and throat pain
- Frequent throat infections, mouth ulcers, and other STIs
- Pregnancy & abortion
- Chronic constipation & UTIs
- Blood in underwear and/or painful urination without a UTI
- Signs of physical trauma or injury

## PARENTAL CONTEXT

- \* Religious enmeshment
- Authoritarian parenting, status and obedience oriented
- Strict disciplinarian, corporal punishment, discipline without explanation
- Morality champion, rule-oriented
- Substance dependence and/or substance trafficking
- Frequent travel & overnight stays
- Frequent guests in home
- Access to technology (photo, video, printing, file sharing capabilities) & knowledge of internet security, P2P forums
- Financially controlling
- Disinterest & disengagement in child's education & overall welfare
- "Weird" (breaks social norms, lack of boundaries)
- Controlling / helicopter / hovering parent
- Domestic abuse in home (mental, emotional, verbal)
- Pathological liar
- Manipulative
- Lack of empathy
- Personal history with childhood sexual, physical abuse, and exposure to domestic violence
- Strict disciplinarian & corporal punishment
- Supervises medical & psychological evaluations, assessments, and examines
- Accepts frequent gifts or donations of value
- \* Parents describe child as overly emotional, dramatic, mentally ill
- Aliases & nicknames
- "Small business" owner (can be anything from a flea market table to ministry to mechanic)
- History of criminal behavior, misuse of resources & poor business practices
- History of involvement with the sex trade
- Involvement with a fundamental religious group or other extremist group

ASK: How do you sleep at night? Do you have nightmares? Do you take medication that makes you sleepy? Do you like being alone with Dad? How about mom?

DO: Always screen for dissociation in conjunction with ADHD & learning disabilities.

REMEMBER: Trafficking can happen in any kind of family in any place anywhere in the USA.
