

# Partial Enrollment Policy -

Greeley County Schools allows any child to enroll part-time in the school district and attend any courses, as well as any educational programs or services directly associated with the courses they are enrolled in or offered during the portion of the day the student is enrolled. Partially enrolled students will not be allowed to participate in other programs or services offered by the school. Including extracurricular activities, field trips not explicitly tied to an educational program or course the student is enrolled in, or services provided outside the hours in which the student is enrolled.

To be eligible for partial enrollment, students must meet the following requirements.

- The student must request to enroll part-time within the school district.
- The student must be concurrently enrolled in a nonaccredited private elementary or secondary school or any other private, denominational or parochial school.
- The student must meet the age of eligibility requirements for school attendance.

Greeley County Schools will make a good faith attempt to accommodate scheduling requests of students seeking partial enrollment within the district. However, it is essential to know that the district can not make adjustments to accommodate every such request.

Seniors on track to meet all graduation requirements by the end of the school year may maintain access to non-educational programs, services, and extracurricular activities as partially enrolled students by applying for and receiving a waiver to do so. To apply for a waiver, the senior must submit a written request which should include a written educational plan, post-secondary plan, the rationale for doing so, and any relevant information that shows the completion of such a plan to be in the student's best interest. An enrollment committee comprised of the building principal, building counselor, superintendent, and primary teachers will review this plan. The committee will decide whether or not to grant a waiver to the senior and the conditions associated with it on a case-by-case basis. If a waiver is granted, the committee will detail the specifics of, but not limited to, when the partial enrollment will start, how it will be carried out, and what non-educational programs, services, and extracurricular activities the student will have access to along with how these will be affected. These determinations will be communicated to the inquiring party and considered final and not subject to an appeal process.
