Keywords: contains special concepts (3-5 words/ phrases).

It is much better to not format your text in a specific technique, instead, just leave it plain except that you really need to type certain words in a "special method", or to emphasize certain word or words. Italic is a must in typing non-English word. A direct quotation is like this:

This section provides an overview of the research methods used during the research process. In this section the author must describe the methods that have been used in detail and logically along with the stages in an effort to conduct a scientific debate, or in an effort to answer the questions asked.

RESULT AND DISCUSSION (BOLD)

Consists of subthemes of the article expressing results of the study and analysis of the study. Begin the results section with a brief introduction that summarizes the aim or objective of the study. This sets the context for the subsequent presentation of the results. Present the collected data in a clear and organized manner. This can be achieved using tables, figures, graphs, or charts, depending on the type of data and the research objectives. Each table or figure should be numbered and accompanied by a descriptive title or caption.

This can be the final conclusion of your discussion and analysis as well as your recommendation for future research projects. The conclusion section should lead the reader to the importance of this research. This can also be followed by recommending relevant future research.
