- A. On the opening page of this chapter, we get a rare overt claim from Rose. He writes, Through all my experiences with people struggling to learn, the one thing that strikes me most is the ease with which we **misperceive** failed performance and the degree to which this misperception both reflects and reinforces the social order. Class and culture erect boundaries that hinder our vision--blind us to the logic of error and the everpresent stirring of language--and encourage the designation of otherness, difference, and deficiency (205).
