

MHS AICE Seniors: Email was sent on May 10th

You may want to forward this email to a parent or your personal email address:

Each year, we provide a list to Cambridge before the June exam session listing all of the students who:

1. Have already earned their AICE Diploma Award (ADIP)
2. When they earned it (which exam session – i.e., June or Nov. of what year)
3. Are entered for their ADIP during the upcoming June exam session
4. The grade level for all of these students

Cambridge will notify Bright Futures after verifying that our list is accurate according to their records. At the moment, Bright Futures does not know which seniors have already earned their ADIP because that information was just requested by Cambridge and sent to them at the end of March. (UPDATE: some seniors have indicated that it is up to date).

Bright Futures will not accept ADIP information before senior year – so they won't take the info. re: those kids who earned it at the end of junior year or even the beginning of senior year. It has to be submitted during the 2nd semester of senior year.

After Bright Futures reviews the list of seniors who have already earned their ADIP, they will check to see that those students have at least 100 hours of community service logged as of the 1st semester report card of senior year. If they do – Bright Futures will update their database and change the status of everyone who meets those two criteria. I'm not sure if that status is changed immediately, or if it has to wait until the end of the school year.

Bright Futures always does a final evaluation at the end of senior year, and that is what the colleges use for their final financial aid calculations because that is when they know which students are 1) attending their university and 2) have confirmation of their Bright Futures status – then the money will be applied to their financial aid calculations.

So you should see a change at some point by the end of this year!

As for college credit – it is not the high school COURSES that convert to college credit, ONLY the AICE exams that are PASSED will potentially earn college credit. All of the public colleges in FL will award credit-by-exam for ANY passing score on an AICE exam. So if you are attending a public college, you will just need to look at which exams you have passed and those are the college credits you will earn (you should have all of your Cambridge certificates).

On the college websites, you can type “credit by exam” or “AICE” into the search bar and you’ll see a list of all of the AICE subjects/Exams, and the specific course credit awarded for a passing score on that exam, at that college. The specific course name/course code may be a little different at each college, depending on what courses they offer.

Don’t forget to submit your Cambridge transcript request through their online submission link: <https://gradetranscripts.cambridgeinternational.org/>
Cambridge sends passing scores only on the electronic transcript.

Your June series score reports will be available on August 12th. You should have received a paper copy of your login information from your English teacher (Tincher or McLean). If you have not received a paper copy, please stop by my office 6-209. I will also send an email as we get closer to the release of results IF you provide me with your personal email address in [THIS FORM](#) since your Flagler Schools email address will no longer be valid upon graduation.
