

CATECHESIS OF THE GOOD SHEPHERD

Dear Friends in the Good Shepherd,

We are looking forward to seeing you at our upcoming formation course from Thursday, October 9th through Saturday, October 11th in the beautiful Shenandoah region of Virginia, hosted by Church of the Lamb. We will begin at 4p at the hosting facility <u>Church of the Incarnation</u>. We encourage you to come early to get parked and oriented to the space. Parking is available downtown and around the church. *see details for the facility below.

The Catechesis of the Good Shepherd seeks to create and facilitate a sacred, hands-on space for children called an Atrium, in which both the children and adults can listen to, ponder and celebrate the most essential mysteries of the Christian faith as revealed in Scripture and Liturgy. Originally cultivated in Rome by Sofia Cavalletti and Gianna Gobbi over sixty years ago, the Catechesis continues to flourish worldwide and is adapted in various Christian traditions.

In our time together, we will enter the mystery of God and the child, from age 3 to 6 years of age and explore a way of being with children that invites us to listen to the voice of the Good Shepherd, who calls us by name. We will share with you the discoveries of Sofia Cavalletti, Gianna Gobbi and Dr Maria Montessori and their contributions to what we know today of children's developmental characteristics and religious potential. Meditations on the biblical and liturgical themes of the Catechesis will be offered as well as guidelines and assistance to parents and catechists to live out this way of being with children in a home or atrium setting for 3- to 6-year-olds. You will discover both the joy and efforts of material making and the preparation of a Catechist's album of presentations and we hope that you find this weekend a retreat-like experience.

This is a certificate course, and participants will be eligible to be certified as a Level I Catechist by the National Association of the Catechesis of the Good Shepherd. A certificate fee of \$35 has been included in your tuition. Participants are expected to attend 90% of all course sessions to receive a certificate of completion.. In addition to the course sessions there are some reading assignments, podcasts, and observation in an Atrium that can be completed as your schedule permits.

Facility Information:

Arrival at Church of the Incarnation located at 75 N. Mason Street, Harrisonburg VA, 22802:

Plan to enter through the double doors on Elizabeth Street. An external pin pad will unlock the exterior set of doors. The pin pad is located on your right on the dark stone part of the building. The keypad code is 1225#. Enter through both sets of double doors. Once in the lobby, bear to the left. There is a gray door for stair access or the elevator will be unlocked.

Parking Options

- 1. Private Lot beside Incarnation: You can find parking in the private lot beside Incarnation; you must enter it via Federal Street to preserve the flow of traffic.
- 2. Street parking outside church entrance: Parking is available as well as various spots on the street where signage allows.
- 3. Elizabeth St. Parking Deck: Additional public parking is available in the public parking deck located on EElizabeth Street. Look for clear signage which allows for free parking within the parking garage.

Dining Options:

Google accurately represents the array of dining options with all the specific information.

We especially like the Friendly City Food Co-Op which is easily accessed via a short walk.

Plan to bring your meals. Light snacks, coffee and hot water for tea are available. A water bottle is also helpful as filtered water is available. We do have breaks for meals and you are welcome to snack/eat whenever is needed in the main gathering area at the facility.
