Syllabus

18.Q1 Process

In this Quest, students will explore seven elements of a digital story and identify the type of story they will create.

COMPLETION TIME: 2 class periods Link to the **18.Q1 Teacher Guide**

18.Q2 Find Your Story

In this Quest, students will select and research a topic for their story.

COMPLETION TIME: 2-3 class periods Link to the **18.Q2 Teacher Guide**

18.Q3 Craft Your Story

In this Quest, students learn to use a hook to capture their audience's attention, select the type of digital story they will create, use a planning document to outline the key elements of their story, and create a storyboard.

COMPLETION TIME: 3-4 class periods Link to the **18.Q3 Teacher Guide**

18.Q4 Finalize It!

In this Quest, **s**tudents finalize their story by receiving feedback from a classmate and completing the final product.
