Internships abroad

Benjamin A. Gilman International Scholarship

The Benjamin A. Gilman International Scholarship Program offers grants for U.S. citizen undergraduate students of limited financial means to pursue academic studies or credit-bearing, career-oriented internships abroad. To be eligible for this award, students must be receiving a Federal Pell Grant or provide proof that he/she will be receiving a Pell Grant during the term of his/her study abroad program or internship.

Boren Awards

The Boren Awards fund the intensive study of language and culture abroad by U.S. undergraduate or graduate students. Boren Scholars and Fellows study a wide range of critical languages and commit to working in positions critical to U.S. national security. Some Boren awards fund internships or research abroad in addition to immersive language study.

<u>Congress-Bundestag Youth Exchange for Young Professionals (CBYX)</u>

The Congress-Bundestag Youth Exchange for Young Professionals (CBYX) is a fellowship funded by the German Bundestag and U.S. Department of State, that annually provides 75 American and 75 German young professionals, between the ages of 18½–24, the opportunity to spend one year in each other's countries, studying, interning, and living with hosts on a cultural immersion program. CBYX is open to candidates in all career fields who are interested in a year of academic, professional, and cultural exchange.

Cultural Vistas Fellowship

A fully-funded fellowship program affording underrepresented U.S. university students the opportunity to intern for eight weeks with organizations in Argentina, Germany, or Southeast Asia.

DAAD - German Academic Exchange Service

Funding for participation in summer internships or senior thesis research at German universities. Long term scholarship are available for semester or year study abroad.

DIWC Scholarship

The Diverse International Women Of Color Summer 2021 Study Abroad Scholarship is intended to assist women of color who are exceptional in their studies and in need of financial assistance to study abroad. DIWC will award (5) \$500 scholarships to women of color who have been accepted to a In-Person Summer 2021 Study Abroad Program, including internships.

Diversity Abroad Overseas Ambassador Program

The Overseas Ambassador Program is an initiative created for current students or recent graduates who are planning to study, intern, volunteer or teach abroad. Overseas Ambassadors earn a stipend in return for representing Diversity Abroad, writing articles, and sharing experiences while abroad. Geared toward economically disadvantaged students, first-generation, students with disabilities and ethnically and racially diverse students.

FACC-Michigan French Business Scholarship: Le Detroit Award

The FACC Michigan Chapter believes that college and university students in business studies and French language studies provide the foundation for the future growth of French-American business relations. The purpose of the FACC-Michigan French Business Scholarship: Le Detroit Award is to assist

college and university students in Michigan who study business or business related courses and French language studies and who plan to combine French and business in their future career plans. Scholarships range from \$1,500 and up, based on merit, need, and the career goals of the student.

Diversity Abroad Overseas Ambassador Program

Hostelling International Explore the World Scholarship

Recipients receive \$2,000 to help finance their international trip that includes an educational or service component. To qualify, applicants must: be 18-30 years old; be U.S. citizens or permanent residents; have demonstrated financial need; reside or attend school in one of the 13 metropolitan areas where HI USA has a community presence; be planning an upcoming international trip that involves an educational and/or volunteer service component.

Human Interaction Project

Recipients will receive a foreign immersion trip combined with volunteering and self-growth. Up to five college-age students a year will be given a travel experience in partnership with the international volunteering and learning organization UBELONG. Open to U.S. citizens between 18 and 30 years old.

The Fund for International Service Learning (FISL)

Scholarships in the amount of \$500 to students enrolled in a semester-long international service-learning program. Recipients are selected based on their academic and professional goals and accomplishments, as well as financial need.

Research abroad

Amgen Scholars

Made possible through a 16-year, \$74 million commitment from the Amgen Foundation, Amgen Scholars allows undergraduates from across the globe to participate in cutting-edge research opportunities at world-class institutions.

24 premier educational and research institutions across the U.S., Europe, Asia, Australia and Canada currently host the summer program.

Boren Awards

The Boren Awards fund the intensive study of language and culture abroad by U.S. undergraduate or graduate students. Boren Scholars and Fellows study a wide range of critical languages and commit to working in positions critical to U.S. national security. Some Boren awards fund internships or research abroad in addition to immersive language study.

Chateaubriand Fellowship Program

The Chateaubriand Fellowship is a grant offered by the Embassy of France in the United States. It supports outstanding Ph.D. students from American universities who wish to conduct research in France for a period ranging from 4 to 9 months.

Chinese Government Scholarships

Funding to support international students, teachers, and scholars to study and conduct research in China at various universities.

DAAD - German Academic Exchange Service

Funding for participation in summer internships or senior thesis research at German universities. Long term scholarships are available for semester or year study abroad.

Fulbright U.S. Student Program

Offers fellowships for U.S. graduating seniors, graduate students, young professionals and artists to study abroad and engage in a research project for one academic year. The Program also includes the English Teaching Assistant work abroad component.

Japanese Government MEXT Scholarship Program

Since 1954, the Government of Japan's Ministry of Education, Culture, Sports, Science and Technology (MEXT or Monbukagakusho) has provided scholarships each year to assist students interested in studying at Japanese universities through the Japanese Government (MEXT) Scholarship Program. As of the 2015 Japanese academic year, some 102,000 students from approximately 160 countries and regions around the world have studied in Japan as Japanese Government (MEXT) Scholarship students. Scholarships include fund for research in Japan.

National Science Foundation Research Experiences for Undergraduates (REU)

REU sites and projects are published as they become available and many are internationally located or are located both abroad and on-site at the U.S. institution responsible for the research project.

ThinkSwiss Research Scholarships

ThinkSwiss Scholarships support highly motivated and qualified U.S. and Canadian undergraduate and graduate students to get a research experience at a public Swiss university or Swiss research institute for 2 to 3 months.
