Write the reference used in the main paper. Do not include references that have never been used as references in writing a script. The style of reference writing is given below. If writing more than three use the name of the main author and 'et al.' To refer to the other writing on the same reference, for example, (Forza et al., 1990; Holmes and Mallick, 2003) at the end of a sentence, or Mallian (2006) states the following sentence
