Abstract

This is where you insert the text of your abstract. Make sure that the abstract, including titles, tables, figures, references, footnotes et cetera, fits two pages, Letter Size with margins of 1 inch (2.54 cm) all around. Reference to the work of Author can be made as Author (year) or, if you are between brackets already, as (see Author, year).

We use the following styles and sizes in the abstract:

- Use the font Times New Roman throughout
- Use ‘small’ or 10 pt for the header of the abstract (that is the compulsory top line of this template stating that your abstract is part of the 22nd PECS).
- Use ‘small’ or 10 pt for references as well as for captions of figures and tables.
- Use ‘large’ or 14 pt and ‘bold’ for the title.
- Use ‘normal’ or 12 pt for the names of the authors.
- Everything else is in ‘normal’ size or 12 pt.
- Print keywords in ‘italics’, 10 pt font and the titles ‘Abstract’ and ‘References’ in bold.

Blank lines are inserted between header and title, title and names of authors, between names of authors and keywords, keywords and abstract. A blank line is inserted also above references; every new reference starts at a new line with an indent. Do not use blank lines to separate paragraphs. Just start a new paragraph on a new line. In the case of more than two authors, separate their names with commas rather than using ‘and’.

References

Author, A.B, Writer, C.D. (year) Title of the paper. Journal, issue, pages (or DOI) and if the reference exceeds one line, make sure that the second and consecutive ones are not indented.
