

Precinct Caucus Operations Updates

The C&B Committee voted unanimously to recommend this proposal to the CCC.

Explanation: This update divides caucus into attendees and participating members and empowers only the members who meet certain qualifications to conduct and vote on business and in elections. This is intended to decrease the level of infiltration we suffer from rival political parties and ideologies.

This division is necessary so that our caucus proceedings might remain open to public attendance while still preserving the privileges of debating, voting, and running solely for registered and vetted members of the Republican Party who share the ideology and support the platform of the Republican Party.

A political party can only serve its basic fundamental purpose when it is able to protect itself from infiltrating opponents of its principles and ideology. This Bylaw update is necessary to protect the Utah and Davis Republican Parties from just such an ongoing infiltration. Permissive membership standards are to a political party what open borders are to a nation!

SECTION 5. PRECINCT CAUCUSES

5.1 Precinct Caucuses.

5.1.1 Precinct Caucuses shall be held at predetermined locations in even-numbered years.

5.1.2 Precinct Caucuses shall be open to public attendance. Each attendee shall be respectful of the caucus proceedings.

5.1.3 Attendees are not granted privileges to make or debate motions, vote on precinct business, vote in precinct elections and polls, or run for officer and delegate positions.

5.1.4 Participating members retain all privileges to make and debate motions, vote on precinct business, vote in precinct elections and polls, and run for officer and delegate positions.

5.1.5 All precinct business shall be conducted by a majority vote of participating members.

5.1.6 Each participating member shall:

- a) Be a currently registered Republican;
- b) Not have publicly supported, promoted, donated to, advocated for, or campaigned for any cause, principle, plank, or platform that is fundamentally in opposition to or incompatible with the DCRP Platform during the previous 1 year;
- c) Be credentialed by precinct leadership; and
- d) Meet all of the qualifications detailed in the Utah Republican Party's Bylaws and Constitution.
