## Springfield Township High School Senior Thesis Seminar 5-Minute Mini-Presentation Assignment and Scoring Guide

Students will prepare a 5-minute mini-presentation that demonstrates their ability to **synthesize** research findings (Annotations 1-5) with visual and oral presentation techniques discussed in class thus far. This presentation will be delivered live before a studio audience (your peers) using Google Slides as your graphic/visual medium. Presentations should serve to **summarize your topic** and/or **focus on a specific sub-topic**. This is your opportunity to demonstrate your understanding of your research topic to date and foreshadow what's to come in terms of your larger thesis presentation.

**Length**: 5 minutes max. (with some wiggle room if needed)

**Slidework**: 5-10 **content** slides, an engaging title slide, and two works cited slides

**Citation**: Works Cited slides at end of presentation (one for **resources** and another for **images**) **Attribution**: Provide oral and written attribution/citation for all evidence (and statistics) presented.

**Speaker notes:** For each slide, include the following in your speaker notes:

>speaker notes with what you plan to say in correspondence with the slide

>in-text citations linking to your resource(s) used

>full MLA image citation for any copyright-friendly image or digital media used

>resource MLA citation
