

# Mr. Mott's Kindergarten News June 11, 2018

### Where We've Been

Last week, we focused on learning about fish - how they behave, how they move, and how to take care of them.

In Reading Workshop, we worked on using all that we have learned about reading to learn about special topics in books we read. We learned how we can pick out the important words (vocabulary words) and tell those to our reading partners.

In Fundations, we reviewed decoding words with short vowels (CVC), long vowels (CVVC, VCe), and the rules that we have learned - when to use c, k, or ck. We also practiced building sentences and changing sentences.

In Writing Workshop, we worked on our persuasive writing. We focused on adding a story to help make our writing more persuasive.

In Math, we practiced finding all the different combinations of a number. We noticed a pattern - that if we went sequential, we can find all the combinations quicker then if we did guess and check.

Mrs. Yolen taught us about strangers and how we shouldn't talk to strangers.

# Where We Are Going

This week, we will be working on closing out the classroom. Please check your child's backpack daily as they will probably be full of things coming home:). Please check around the house for Guided Reading books (not the paper ones), classroom books, and Library books! Students will get to take home their crayon bags, writing + reading + communications folders + Book Choice Bags.

In Fundations, we will continue to review what we've learned about words - CVC, long vowel, and Bossy R words.

In Math, we will review what we've learned about teen numbers, addition, and subtraction.

In Writing Workshop, students will get to free write! When your child's folder comes up, remember that most of the stories they wrote independently on their own!

# **Getting Ready for First Grade!**

(Some ideas to do this summer to get ready for next year!)

### Reading / Phonic Skills

- o Read nightly to your child talk about the story who, what, where, when, why?
- o Enroll in a summer reading program through the Base or Groton Public Library.
- o Have your child read stories to you.
- Review tapping and blending sounds in words.
- o Review sight words.

## **Writing Skills**

• Have your child keep a journal of things they do over the summer, write about stories they read, or have them come up with their own stories.

#### **Math Skills**

- o Practice counting to 100 by ones, fives, and tens.
- o Practice writing numerals to 100.
- Practice adding and subtracting.
- o Review using 5 and 10 groups to make numerals.
