

PROGRAM OVERVIEW

What is Angeleno Corps? How long is the program?

Angeleno Corps is a 10-month program (from Sept. 2022 to June 2023) that provides 18 to 24-year-olds with the opportunity to serve their community while gaining work experience and professional development, pursuing their education, and receiving a \$1,000 monthly stipend. Participants complete their service in one of five areas:

- Education and Child Care (Youth Development Corps)
- Health, Climate and Environmental Justice (Health Equity Corps)
- Nutrition and Food Justice (Food Justice Corps)
- Technology and Digital Assistance (Future Corps)
- Immigration Assistance (Dream Corps)

Funding for Angeleno Corps is provided by Californians For All Youth Jobs Corps, an innovative partnership between the State of California and the City of Los Angeles to help underserved youth find employment.



What are the program requirements?

Participants will complete 40 hours of service monthly (approximately 10 hours/week) at an assigned partner organization from September 2022 through June 2023. Corps Members must also be enrolled Full-Time in school or a vocational program throughout the program. Lastly, Corps Members will participate in one-on-one and professional development meetings twice a month. These meetings will be in-person and remote.

APPLICATION

What are the requirements to apply? Participants must:

- Be 18 to 24 years old
- Live in the City of Los Angeles
- Have valid documentation to work
- Meet income eligibility requirements
- Attend school/a vocational program Full-Time from September 2022 to June 2023
 (Note: Applicants will be required to submit proof of education enrollment)
- Be fully vaccinated against COVID-19

What documentation do I need to apply?

- Photo ID
- Social Security Card
- Proof of Residency in the City of Los Angeles
- Proof of Educational Enrollment
- Total Family Income in 6 months

How do I apply? What steps should I take?

- 1. Visit HireLA's Youth and select 'Apply Now'
- 2. Create an Application and answer the eligibility Questions
- 3. Choose a YouthSource Center*
 - View the map and select a YouthSource Center close to your home or school
 *Note: The YouthSource Center you select will impact your Worksite options. For example, if you choose a YouthSource Center in South LA, you will be assigned to an organization in South LA.
- 4. If you are eligible, you can select Angeleno Corps and confirm your YouthSource Center
- 5. Submit your application by June 19, 2022

Will applications be accepted after June 19, 2022?

Applicants will be accepted and reviewed on a rolling basis after June 19, 2022.

Can I reapply if I participated last year?

If you completed the program last year, you cannot apply again. Our program covers foundational professional development to prepare you for future jobs and careers. However, you can find other workforce programs by visiting https://hirelayouth.com.

Can I participate in Angeleno Corps and another HireLA program simultaneously?

You can only participate in one program at a time.

PROGRAM ACCEPTANCE

How will Angeleno Corps Members be chosen?

Angeleno Corps will prioritize young people formerly disconnected from work or school, full-time students in the Los Angeles Community College District, and those living within ZIP Codes highly impacted by COVID-19. Applicants will then be invited to a 20-30 minute interview in order of priority. Once interviews are complete, 400 applicants will be invited to participate in the program.

How and when will I find out if I am accepted? When will the program start?

All Angeleno Corps communication will happen via email. Please check your email regularly (including your spam). Please see an approximate program timeline below.

- May 10th Application Opens
- June 19th Application Closes
- June & July Applicants interview and select their top organizations of interest
- July Finalists are selected and notified
- Mid-July to August Corps Members enroll, complete onboarding with their assigned organization,
 workforce readiness training, and attend orientation
- Early September Corps Members begin their service work
- June 2023 Program ends

PARTNER ORGANIZATIONS

Where will Angeleno Corps members complete their service? Are there virtual work opportunities? How will partner organizations be assigned?

Corps Members will be assigned to one of over 50 community-based organizations that serve residents impacted by the pandemic. Each organization works in one of five service areas (digital equity, education and childcare, family immigration, nutrition and food justice, and health equity). Our partner organizations work remotely, in person, or both (hybrid). We will share information on our partner organizations, including descriptions of work duties, schedule requirements, locations, and onboarding requirements. Participants will select their top organizations of interest. We will do our best to match students based on their preferences, availability permitting.

How will my work schedule be decided?

Students will schedule their work hours based on any schedule requirements at their assigned partner organization.
