EXAMPLE.

Justin Tosi and Brandon Warmke's book aims to explain why contemporary public moral discourse feels so undeniably antagonistic, polarized, and cruel.....

Drawing on a wide range of evidence from philosophy, psychology, and political science, the authors argue that this unsavory state of affairs stems in part from the pervasive abuse of moral speech in the pursuit of social status, or moral grandstanding.....

[max. 3 pages, min. 2 pages]

Explaining in 6-7 paragraphs what the book is about

Dont give any spoilers or revealing plot twists. Authors can compare the book with other books with similar topics.

If you're unsure whether sharing a synopsis will help your review, use your best judgment.

Give your critiques and praises honestly in 4-5 paragraphs

Show what are the unique of the book.

Demonstrate to your audience why the book is good or bad to read. Don't make it too simple by merely mentioning good or awful; instead, assist your audience in forming their own thoughts about the book.

Give your recommendations in 1-2 paragraphs.

Share your conclusion about the book.

NOTE: You're writing a review for a book that another person poured their heart and soul into. Don't be rude when you express your honest view.
