Will it be new legislation or an executive order? <u>Ch</u>	allenge: It's a time consuming process. Adoption
of policy takes considerable amount of time, proce	ss can be difficult and often times controversial.

the government make sure the general public will	know about them? What are the consequences for
individuals, states, organizations that do not follov	v the new policy? <u>Challenges</u> : uniformity and
equal application of the law to all levels of gov't	
5) : What positive	e changes have resulted from the policy? What are
the challenges? What are the unforeseen problems	? What have been the unexpected costs?
Challenges: Will the policy be evaluated in the sam	e way by different government entities? "Throw
out" the policy or just amended it? Differing opinio	ons on how to fix the policy.
