Lesson 28 Questions

First Day: Read the Lesson 27 Notes.

The notes and lecture fortify the truth of the passage for understanding and application to daily life.

1. How did the lecture help clarify the role of works in a Christian's life?
2. How did the notes encourage you to join God in His gospel work?

Second Day: Read Romans 16:1-16.

Paul greeted beloved believers in Rome.

3. What repeated phrases did Paul use to describe the people he greeted? Why is this significant?
4. What principles for Christian ministry does Paul's list of greetings reveal?
5. a. According to these verses, what were some ways people loved and supported Paul?
b. How has God supported or provided for you through others? How have you expressed gratitude?

Third Day: Read Romans 16:17-20.

Paul offered a warning to the believers in Rome.

6. a. What warning did Paul offer?
b. According to this passage, how can believers recognize divisive and deceptive people?
c. How did Paul advise believers to respond to divisive and deceptive people?
7. Give examples of what it could look like to be "wise about what is good, and innocent about what is evil." (See also Matthew 10:16; Romans 12:21; and other Scriptures you know.)
8. What assurances does Paul offer in verse 20? How do his assurances apply to a situation in your life?

Fourth Day: Read Romans 16:21-23.

Believers in Corinth greeted the believers in Rome.

9. Who were the people with Paul, and what do you learn about them in these verses?
10. What does this list teach you about the value of relationships in life and Christian ministry?
11. How might God be prompting you to support your church with your gifts, resources, or position of influence?

Fifth Day: Read Romans 16:24-27.

Paul gave glory to God forever through Jesus Christ.

12. In your own words, summarize the gospel message Paul proclaimed about Jesus Christ in the book of Romans.
13. What is the mystery Paul referred to in verse 25? (See also Ephesians 3:2-6; Colossians 1:27.)
14. Give glory to God by writing down what you learned about His character and plans through this study.

Sixth Day: Review Romans 16.

Godly relationships reflect the transformative power of the gospel.

15. How have the truths of the gospel in Romans impacted your relationships with others and with the Lord?
