

How to Create a Compelling College Application & Supplemental Essays

April 8 - April 29, 2025 Foundational Track

This training is the second half of my Counselor Training Program. I recommend taking the courses consecutively, as they complement one another, but you're welcome to join for just one.

What Is This Course?

This course provides a values-based, step-by-step approach to helping students a) understand how all the written components of the college application fit together, and b) write stand-out supplemental essays, activities lists, and additional information sections.

How the Course Works

Each week you'll watch a set of short video lessons and, at the end of each week, we'll meet for a live 90-minute session to discuss the content & best practices, review essays, and hold Q&A.

Important: I know counselors are busy people, so all the homework for this course is optional.

Can't make a live session? No worries; you'll have the recordings so you can catch up later, and you'll have access to this course forever. Recordings are uploaded to the course within 1-2 business days after each live session.

Course Overview

We'll begin by exploring brainstorming exercises designed to help your students discover essay topics that can be used for multiple prompts (what I call a "Super Essay"), then we'll dive into techniques for upleveling the activities list, additional info section, and "Why us?" essay.

On each live session, we'll do a quick homework review, after which I'll lead a mini-lesson on a topic relevant to that week's theme (i.e., The "Why us" essay), then segue into a lengthy Q&A (usually 30+ questions answered).
